Directions for this assignment: This assignment has questions mixed in with directions. If you see a question mark in the step that you are reading, that means you ANSWER THAT QUESTION! If you do not see a question mark, that means that you read and follow that direction step, and if the step does not tell you to write anything, then you do not write anything down.

You must answer every question with complete sentence answers. That means that you must put all of the words from the question in the answer.

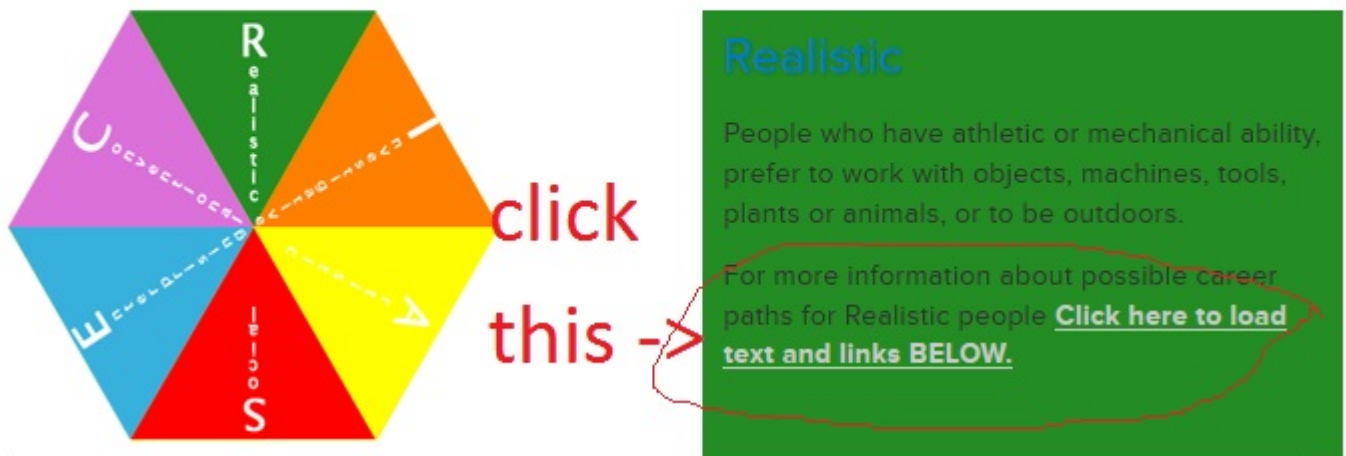

1. To figure out your Holland code, go to the website listed above. Read the text on the page. The directions on the page tell you about this assignment, **YOU HAVE TO READ THEM**. It will tell you that you need to choose three categories out of the six possible below. The categories are: **Realistic**, **Investigative**, **Artistic**, **Social**, **Enterprising**, and **Conventional**. You will need to click on each word on the pinwheel to figure out what each word means for this assignment. Once you click on the word, the wheel will spin and the definition will be displayed to the right. (**direction step only**)
2. After you have clicked on all of the words, you need to pick **THREE** words out of the six in the pinwheel and write them down. Write them down IN ORDER of which ones you are the most interested in. (For example, if you liked Realistic, Social, and Enterprising, write those down in that order, from the one you like the most to the one you like the least) Then you will need to write down the three letter code of what your Holland code is. To find out what your three letter code is you will need to Take the first letter from each category and form them into one “word”. (For example if you had chosen Investigative as your first choice, Artistic as your second choice, and Enterprising as your third choice, your Holland Code would be IEA). (Other examples are: RIA, SEC, CES ... Make sure you put the letters in the order you chose them.) (**answer on your word document**)
3. Above on the pinwheel, you need to click on the category word that was your first choice (this would be the first word out of the three that you have written down). On the right hand side there will be a link under that word that says “Click here to load text and links BELOW.” Click that link to make the other information show up. (**direction step only**)

- There will be questions that are asked, you will need to answer these. Click where it says “ARE YOU?”. There will be a list of words. Do you think any of those words describe you? Which words describe you and why (pick at least two words and say why they describe you) (**answer on your word document**)
- Now click the link where it says “CAN YOU?”. There will be a list of things that a person in this category should be able to do. Which of these statements are you able to do? (pick two of these and say why you are able to do them) (**answer on your word document**)
- Now click the link where it says “LIKE TO?”. There will be a list of things here that you should like to do if this is the first category you picked. Which of these statements do you like to do? (pick two of these and tell why you like to do them) (**answer on your word document**)
- Now click the link where it says “HOBBIES?”. There will be a list of things here that are hobbies that you can do. Which of these hobbies do you or would you like to do? (pick two of these hobbies and say why you do or why you would like to do them) (**answer on your word document**)
- Now click on where it says “CAREER POSSIBILITIES (Holland Code)”. Once you can read all of the jobs, you will need to list **all** of the careers with your **THREE LETTER HOLLAND CODE THAT YOU MADE ABOVE!** (You do not write every single job that is listed, you look for the jobs that have your three letter code next to them. If the job has your three letter code, then you write it down.) (If you only have a few, you may switch the last two letters of the code. Such as, if your Holland code was IEA, you could switch it to IAE. If there are no jobs that match the Holland code you have, then you will need to pick a new Holland code). (**answer on your word document**)
- Now pick a job from this list that you are interested in and click on it. This will open up a new website for the Occupational Outlook Handbook (O*net online) with some information about your job. You can read the page to find out more information about your job, and answer the questions below. Read the summary that is displayed to make sure that you want to answer the questions on this job. Once you are sure, continue following the directions. **MAKE SURE TO WRITE DOWN THE NAME OF THE JOB YOU HAVE CHOSEN** (**answer on your word document**)
- Underneath where it says “View Report”, “Summary” should be clicked by default when you come to the webpage. Now click on the word “Details”. This will allow you to see more information, which may help you

understand what is of most importance to you on this career. **(direction step only)**

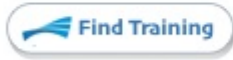

11. Look on the page where it says “Tasks”. You will see some information about what your job does Read this and then here you will need to write a 4 sentence summary. You can use the ratings numbers and talk about some of the items listed. **(answer on your word document)**
12. Next, look on the page where it says “Tools & Technology”. Read this and then here you will need to write a 4 sentence summary about the Tools & Technology for your job. **(answer on your word document)**
13. Look on the page where it says “Knowledge”. Read this and then here you will need to write a 4 sentence summary about the knowledge required for this job. You can use the ratings numbers and talk about some of the items listed. **(answer on your word document)**
14. Under where it says “Skills”, read this and then write a 4 sentence summary about the Skills used at this job. You can use the ratings numbers and talk about some of the items listed. **(answer on your word document).**
15. Under where it says “Abilities”, read this and then write a 4 sentence summary about the Abilities used at this job. You can use the ratings numbers and talk about some of the items listed. **(answer on your word document).**
16. Under where it says “Work Activities” heading, read this and then write a 4 sentence summary about the Work Activities done at this job. You can use the ratings numbers and talk about some of the items listed. Also include a few of the items listed under “Detailed Work Activities” underneath this, as one of your sentences. **(answer on your word document).**
17. Under where it says “Work Context”, read this and then write a 4 sentence summary about the Work Context for this job. You can use the ratings numbers and talk about some of the items listed. You can also use some of the words from the questions asked to make your paragraph. **(answer on your word document).**
18. Under where it says “Job Zone”, read this and then write a 4 sentence summary about the Job Zone for this job. **(answer on your word document).**
19. Under where it says “Education”, read this and then write a 2 sentence summary about the Education required for this job. Put the percentages of each education level required in a sentence, if it has them. **(answer on your word document).**

20. Under where it says “Credentials”, Here you will need to click on the 3 links below. The links are Find Training, Find Certifications, and Find Apprenticeships. These are all ways that you can start to plan to be able to get this job that you want! Click each link, and then choose Virginia as your state (if it asks you). Then write down a few of the things that you could do, and some of the information when you click on each thing you see and read about. You should have 3 sentences here at least. **(answer on your word document)**.

22. Under where it says “Work Values”, read this and then write a 4 sentence summary about the Work Values that are important at this job. **(answer on your word document)**.
23. Under where it says “Related Occupations”, read this and then write at least 4 Related Occupations for this job. You can do this in 1 sentence. **(answer on your word document)**.
24. Under where it says “Wages & Employment Trends”, read this and then write a 4 sentence summary about the Wages & Employment Trends for this job. **(answer on your word document)**.
25. What do you like about this job? **(answer on your word document)**
26. What do you not like about this job? **(answer on your word document)**
27. Have you seen or learned about the career you were interested in before we started the Holland Code career research assignment? **(answer on your word document)**
28. Does the job you picked relate to any other jobs you have researched in this class? Which job and why? If it does not relate to any other job you have researched, does this job match up with you better and why? **(answer on your word document)**
29. Which test do you think was more accurate, the Virginia View test or the Holland Code game? Why? **(answer on your word document)**
