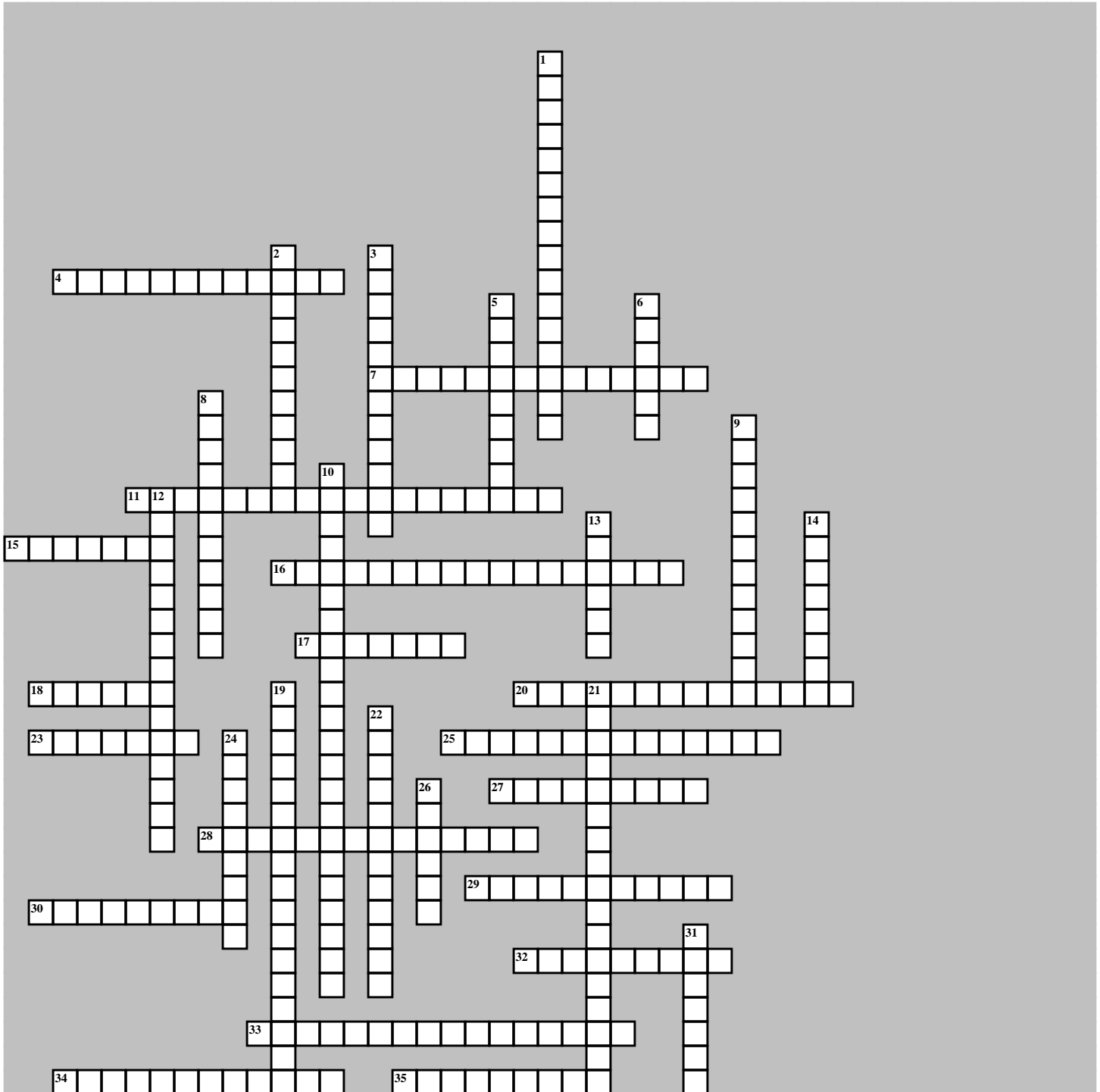

- 4 A paper document issued as legal tender by the government on its authority and credit and designed to circulate as money. The Constitution forbids a state from issuing this. (3 words)
- 7 Someone who is found not guilty of a crime is put on trial again for the same crime. The Constitution prevents this from happening. (2 words)
- 11 The division of the national government into three branches instead of having one all-powerful branch. (3 words)
- 15 To keep someone or something from having, keeping, or obtaining; to take away.
- 16 System established by the framers of the Constitution to prevent any branch of government from becoming too powerful. (3 words)
- 17 A crime that undermines the offender's government.
- 18 An indirect tax on the manufacture, sale, or distribution of goods or services.
- 20 The part of the government headed by the Supreme Court that interprets the laws. (2 words)
- 23 An election in which different people compete to be their party's candidate for political office.
- 25 Powers that are specifically given to the federal government in the Constitution. (2 words)

- 27 Free from bias, not favoring one over another.
- 28 Members of both major political parties working together.
- 29 In Latin this means "after the fact." The Constitution does not allow for a law that makes illegal an act that was legal when committed, increases the penalties for an infraction after it has been committed, or changes the rules of evidence to make conviction easier. (3 words)
- 30 To list something one by one or to count to determine the number or amount of. The 9th amendment uses this word to refer to the list of rights in the previous eight amendments.
- 32 To divide and share according to a plan for a special purpose.
- 33 A law that goes against or contradicts the Constitution of the United States.
- 34 The first ten amendments to the Constitution. (3 words)
- 35 An addition made to the Constitution.

- 2 The act of postponing or suspending something to another time or place. An example of this is when Congress stops meeting.
- 3 The right and power to interpret and apply the law.

- 5 The power of a court to review and possibly reverse a lower court's decision.
- 6 The minimum number of members needed at a meeting to make official decisions.
- 8 The process of bringing charges against a government official in order to remove him or her from office.
- 9 Powers not specifically granted by the Constitution but which are exercised. (2 words)
- 10 One of the two parts of Congress known as the lower house that is made up according to the population of the states. (3 words)
- 12 The part of the government headed by the President that enforces the law. (2 words)
- 13 To be in agreement with someone. To agree; to cooperate.
- 14 A type of government in which the citizens elect representatives to manage the government, which is usually headed by a president.
- 19 The part of the government made up of the Congress and government agencies that has the power to make laws. (2 words)
- 21 An agreement between two or more states. The Constitution provides that states may not enter into such agreements without the consent of Congress. (2 words)

- 22 A right that no person can be held or imprisoned without a trial or just cause. Someone who has been unlawfully arrested has to be released. (2 words)
- 24 The cancellation of civil rights. This may happen to someone who has been found guilty of committing a serious crime.
