

Biography of C.S. Lewis



Clive Staples Lewis was born in Belfast, Ireland, on 29 November 1898. His father was Albert James and his mother was Florence Augusta. He had a brother Warren. His nickname was Jack.

When he was younger he was fascinated by anthropomorphic animals, which means half human and half any animal, for example a centaur. One of his favourite authors was Beatrix Potter, who wrote about animals from the forest.

Before Lewis went to a school like me he was tutored at home, later he went to Wynyard School in Watford. His mother died when he was 10 years old in 1908. After this he went to a number of different schools, eventually he was awarded a scholarship to University College, Oxford.

After all his learning Lewis wrote a number of popular novels, which included his including fantasy fiction Narnian books and science fiction books, The Space Trilogy. The themes such were mainly Christian themes as sin, falling from grace and redemption.
