☐ Foreshadowing

☐ "The Walker is abroad, he said again, and this night is bad and tomorrow will be beyond imagining" (Cooper 7).

- This passage creates a feeling of suspense in the reader.
- The reader is unsure about what is going to happen tomorrow but knows that it will be worse than what is happening now.

☐ Personification & simile

☐ "The fear jumped at him for the third time like a great animal that had been waiting to spring" (Cooper 17).

- By comparing Will's fear to a great animal, Cooper makes the reader feel that Will is under attack by his fears.
- His fear has taken on a life of its own and is out of his control.

☐ foreshadowing

☐ "It was getting worse every minute. As if some huge weight were pushing at his mind, threatening, trying to take him over, turn him into something he didn't want to be" (Cooper 16).

The author wants the reader to feel uncertain or worried. It seems like something is happening to Will that he doesn't understand. Also, it makes the reader curious about what Will might be turning into.

It foreshadows that Will is about to discover that he is an Old One.
