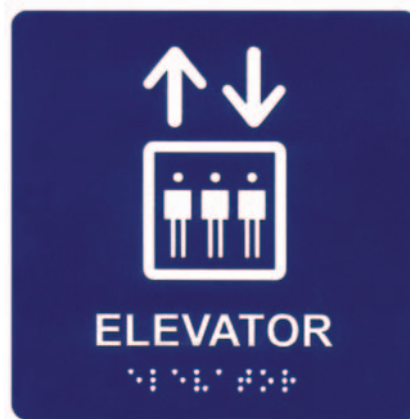




Reading with Your Fingers

People who can't see can still read. How? They use the Braille alphabet. In Braille, little bumps on the page stand for each letter. By touching the bumps, a person who knows Braille can read a book or a letter from a friend.

Some signs you see around you every day are written using Braille letters and numbers, too. The next time you ride in an elevator, look for the Braille bumps near the elevator sign.
