  - through a low-cost public awareness campaign on billboards, sides of buses, and PSAs on local stations
  - by continuing our legislative advocacy efforts to make it mandatory for school districts to abide by current education code requirements
  - by finding school library non-supporters, addressing their misconceptions about school libraries, and encouraging their future involvement in helping us further spread our message

I look forward to seeing everyone at our Spring workshop, which will be in beautiful San Diego. Details and a save the date announcement will be coming soon.

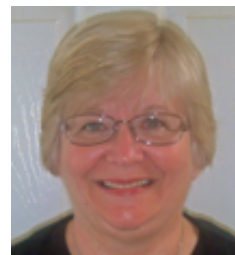
more. I also love to read, travel, connect with my library friends, and enjoy time with my husband, 21-year-old daughter, and our dog, Arlo.

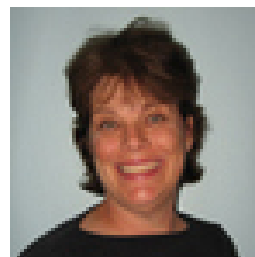

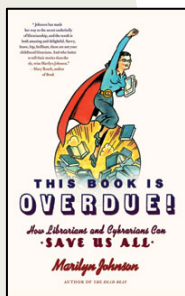
