

Deutsches Museum



The Verkehrszentrum is a branch of the Deutsches Museum in Munich. It is located in three historical monumental halls on the Theresienhöhe and shows exhibits on transport and mobility.



The Verkehrszentrum was opened in May 2003, with the Hall III Mobility and Technology, in October 2006 followed the City Hall I and Hall II transport travel culture. In October 2011, the newly built hall was opened with attached offices, small conference room, visitor lobby, cashier and shop, after two years of construction.

The Deutsches Museum (German Museum) in Munich is the world's largest museum of technology and science, with approximately 1.5 million visitors per year and about 28,000 exhibited objects from 50 fields of science and technology. The museum was founded on June 28, 1903, at a meeting of the Association of German Engineers (VDI) as an initiative of Oskar von Miller. The full name of the museum in English is: German Museum of Masterpieces of Science and Technology (German: Deutsches Museum von Meisterwerken der Naturwissenschaft und Technik). It is the largest museum in Munich.
