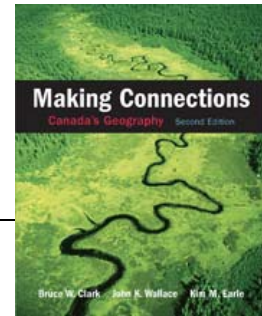


# Fishing

- 5) Some people think that when the Atlantic fishery recovers, most of the resource should be allocated to the inshore fishery because it supports a way of life. Other people believe the offshore fishery should get most of the fish because it catches fish more efficiently and produces higher paying jobs. Write a paragraph indicating with which view you agree and why.
- 6) Identify and briefly explain the factors that may have led to the collapse of the west coast fishery.
- 7) Write a brief, two paragraph report comparing the collapse of the east coast fishery with the collapse of the west coast fishery.
- 8) In what ways is aquaculture a good thing? In what ways is aquaculture a bad thing?
