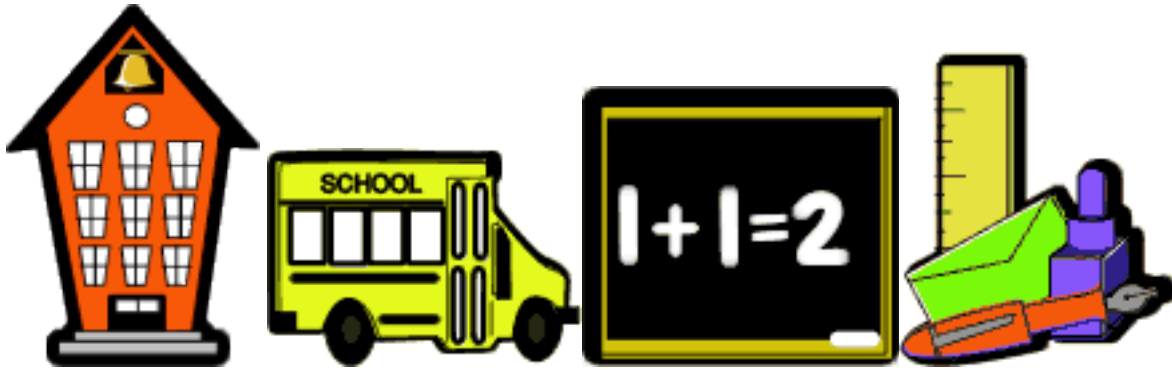

An alert will be sent to either your home phone number, OR the primary phone number you have registered with the district. You can log onto your profile at any time to update your contact information. Maintaining the accuracy of your profile will increase the ability of the school to keep you informed.
