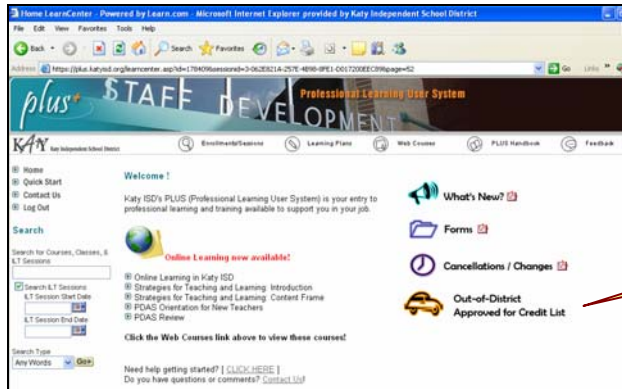
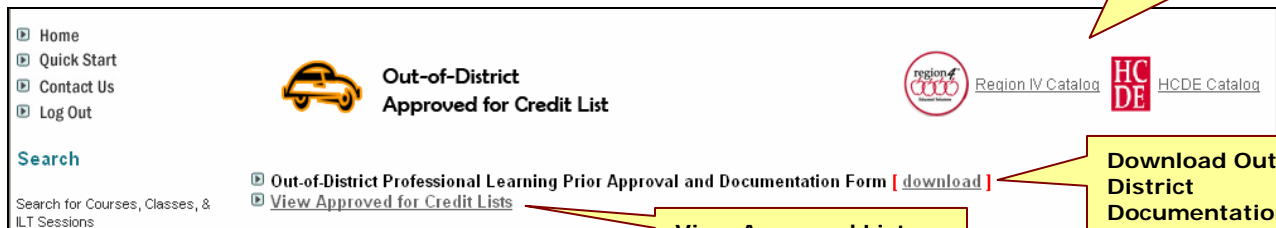

Step-by-step directions

### STEP 1: before you go ...

complete **Part 1** of the Out-of-District Professional Learning Prior Approval and Documentation Form electronically then print the form.

### STEP 2: before you go ...

complete **Part 2** of the Out-of-District Professional Learning Prior Approval and Documentation Form.

- Obtain **principal/supervisor's signature** on the Out-of-District Prior Approval and Documentation form **before** you attend the training if the training is not listed on one of the lists below.
- Obtain the **GT Director's signature** on the Out-of-District Prior Approval and Documentation form **before** you attend a training for which you intend to earn GT Update credit **if** the training is not listed in the GT Approved for Credit List below.

### STEP 3:

Obtain Funding as needed.
