Africa → America - Slaves

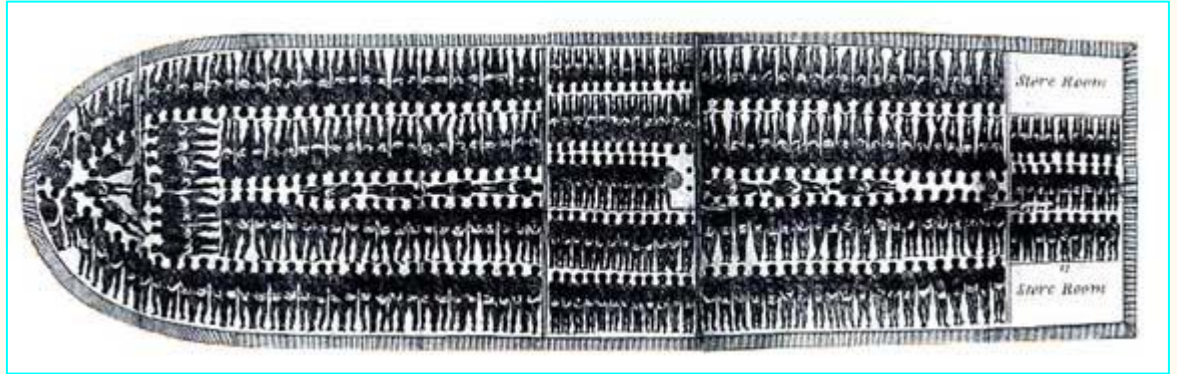
America → Europe - Sugar, tobacco, and cotton
