

# Hands-on Project Directions

## Project Topic Options

- Interview a colleague about a funny or surprising moment in teaching (done in pairs)
  - Include a photo of yourself with a surprised or funny look; take the photo in PhotoBooth, it will appear for use in GarageBand
  - URL -- Google “odd news” for ideas
- Introduce yourself as a teaching super hero
  - Explain what your particular super power is in the classroom
  - Include a photo of yourself using PhotoBooth; use one of the Effects selections to illustrate your super power

- Create a Public Service Announcement about your course
  - Give up to three reasons your course is one of the most important students will take in high school

## Project Goals

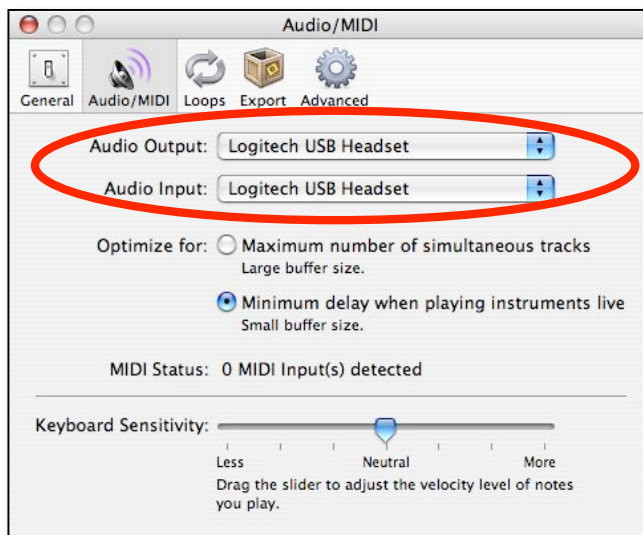
- Two to five-minute running time including:
- 1 to 4 minutes of audio
- 2 to 5 photos/graphics with “chapter” markers
- 1 to 3 live URLs
- music lead-in and fade-out with ducking (from GarageBand)

# Steps

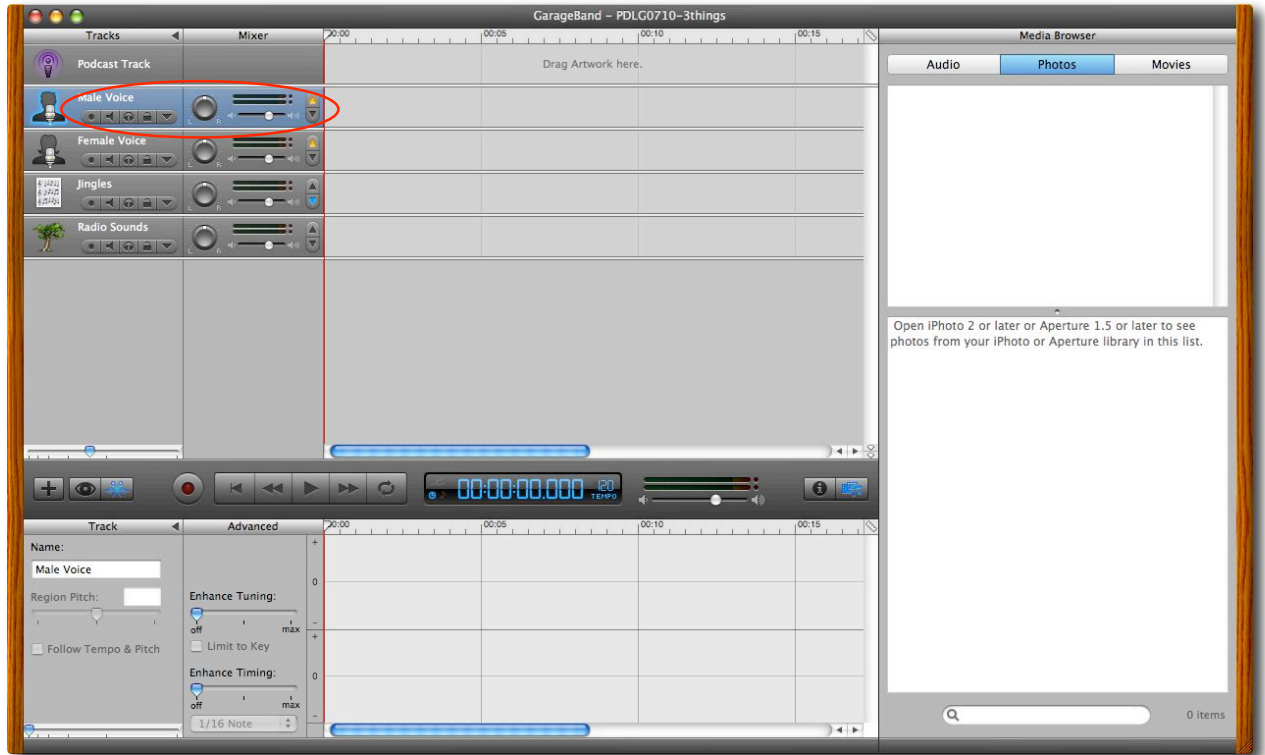
1. Determine project type (surprise/funny; superhero; PSA; own)
2. Gather Photos
  - Launch PhotoBooth -- take self portrait with or without effects
  - Google search for images (just one or two)
3. Sound Source
  - Connect mic (if using headset mic or SnowBall)
  - Record, then Sync iPod with iTunes (if using iTalk with iPod)
4. Launch GarageBand -- Select New Podcast Episode



5. GarageBand > Preferences > Audio/MIDI -- set Audio Input/Output

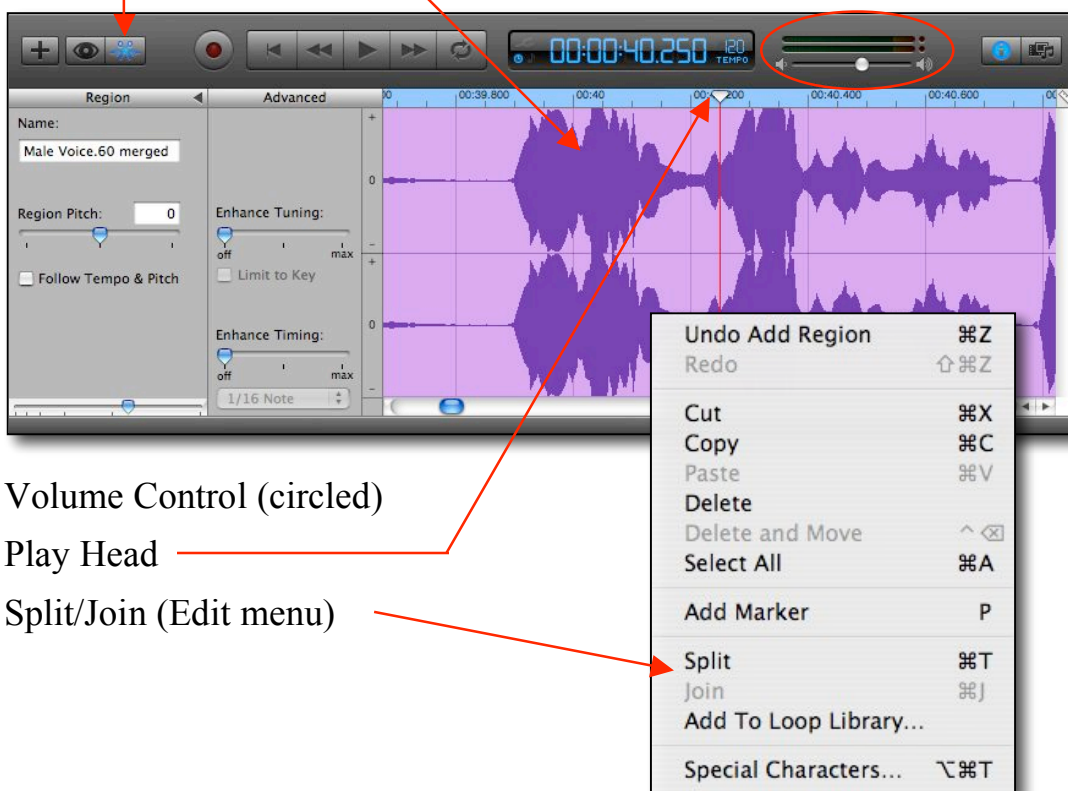


6. Record vocal track (or import voice memo from iTunes) -- SAVE



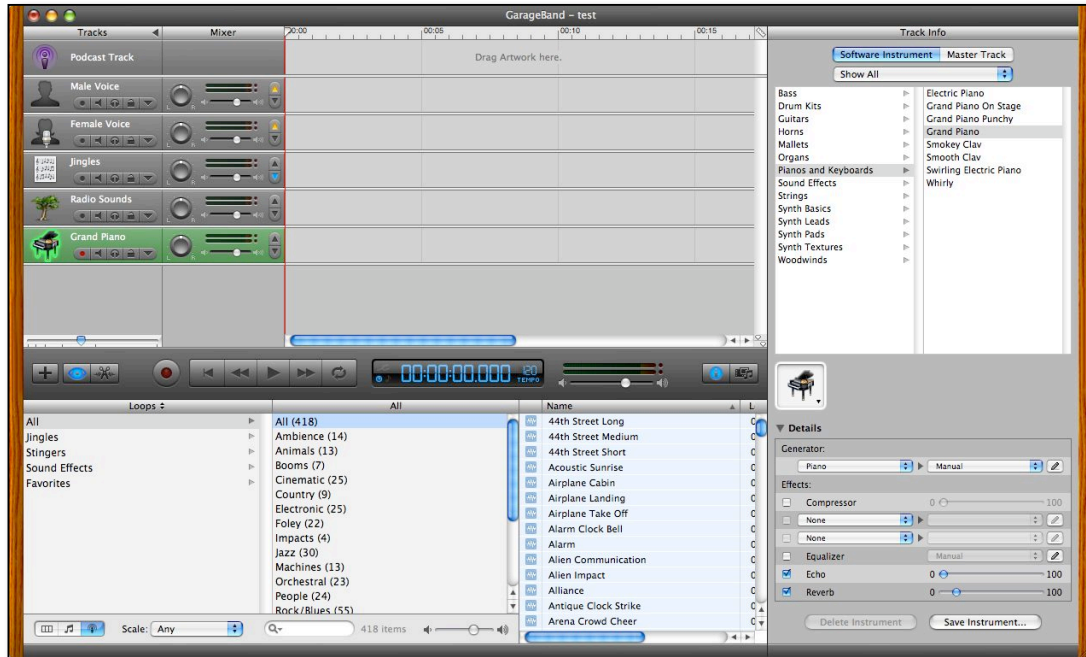
7. Make essential edits – SAVE

- Track Editor and Wave Forms



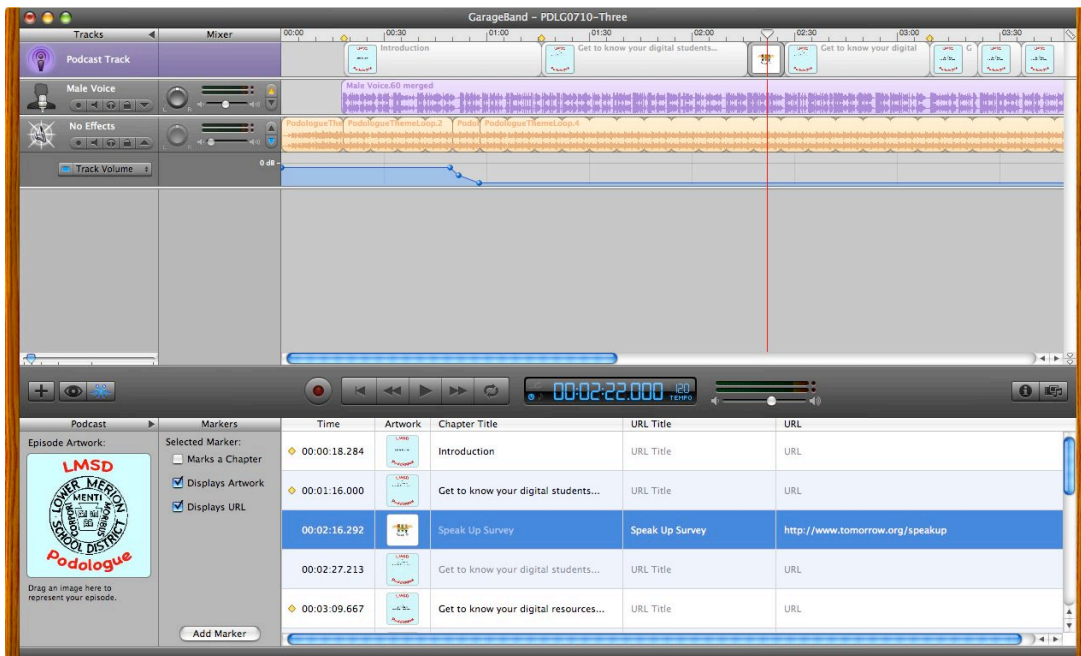
- Volume Control (circled)
- Play Head
- Split/Join (Edit menu)

## 8. Add GarageBand music loop -- use Ducking – SAVE

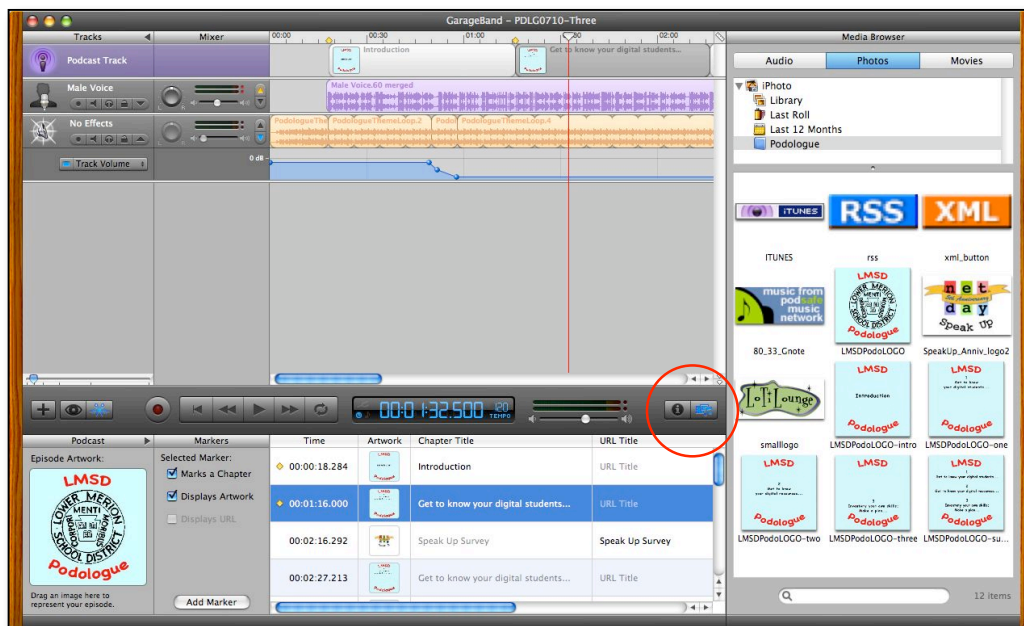


- Preview in Loop Browser
- Drag selection from Browser to New Basic Track
- Typically begin music before narration and end after
- Ducking is turned on by default; check individual track settings

## 9. Mark chapters with Podcast Track selected -- SAVE



## 10. Add photos (from iPhoto and/or PhotoBooth) – SAVE



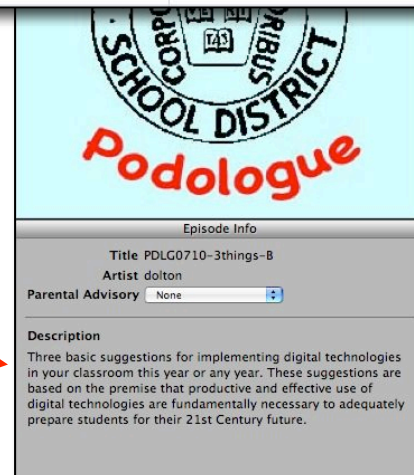
- Open Media Browser (button circled)
- Drag Episode/Chapter artwork from Media Browser to Track Editor
- Double-Click to adjust image

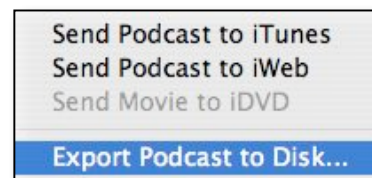

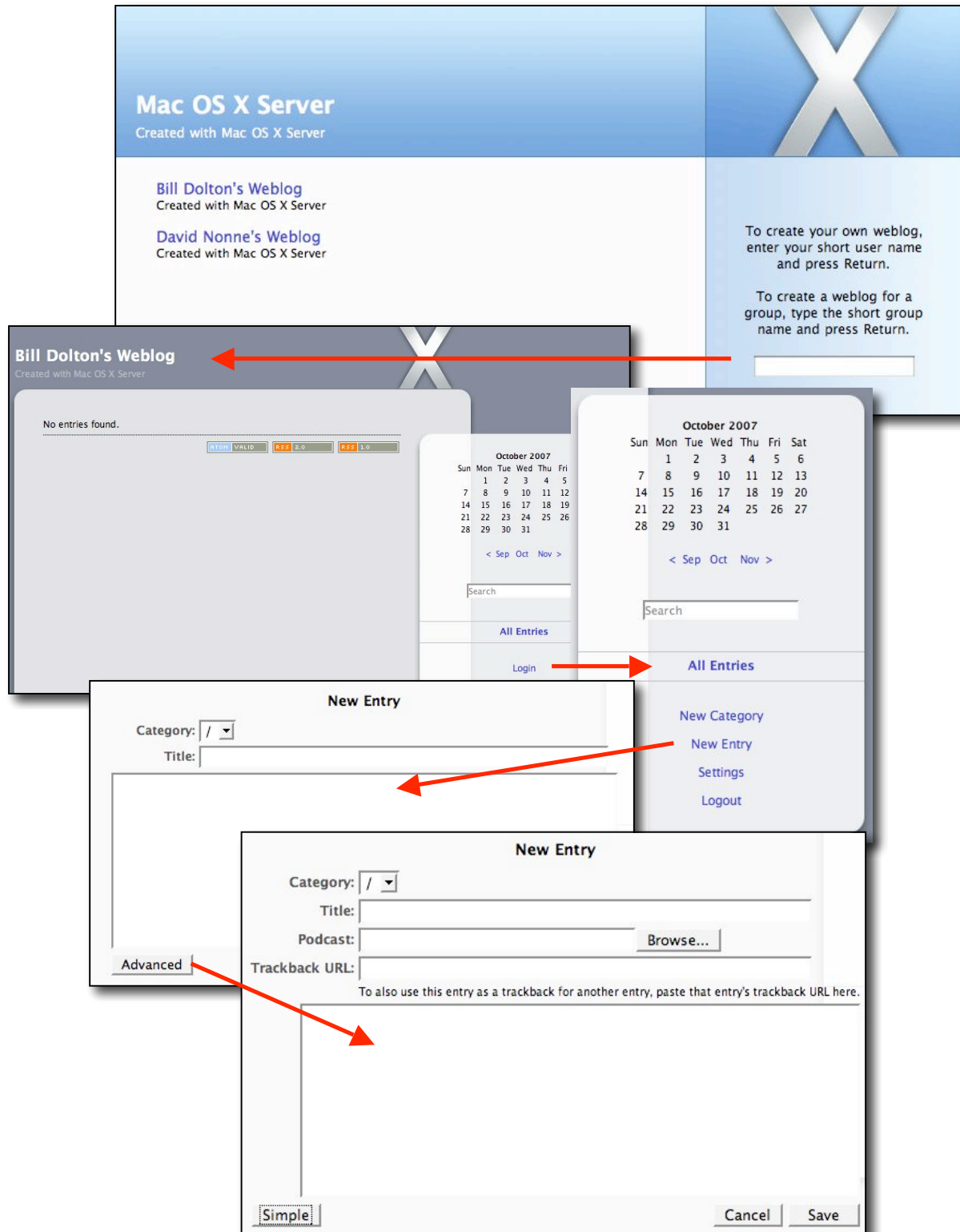
