



Reading Log



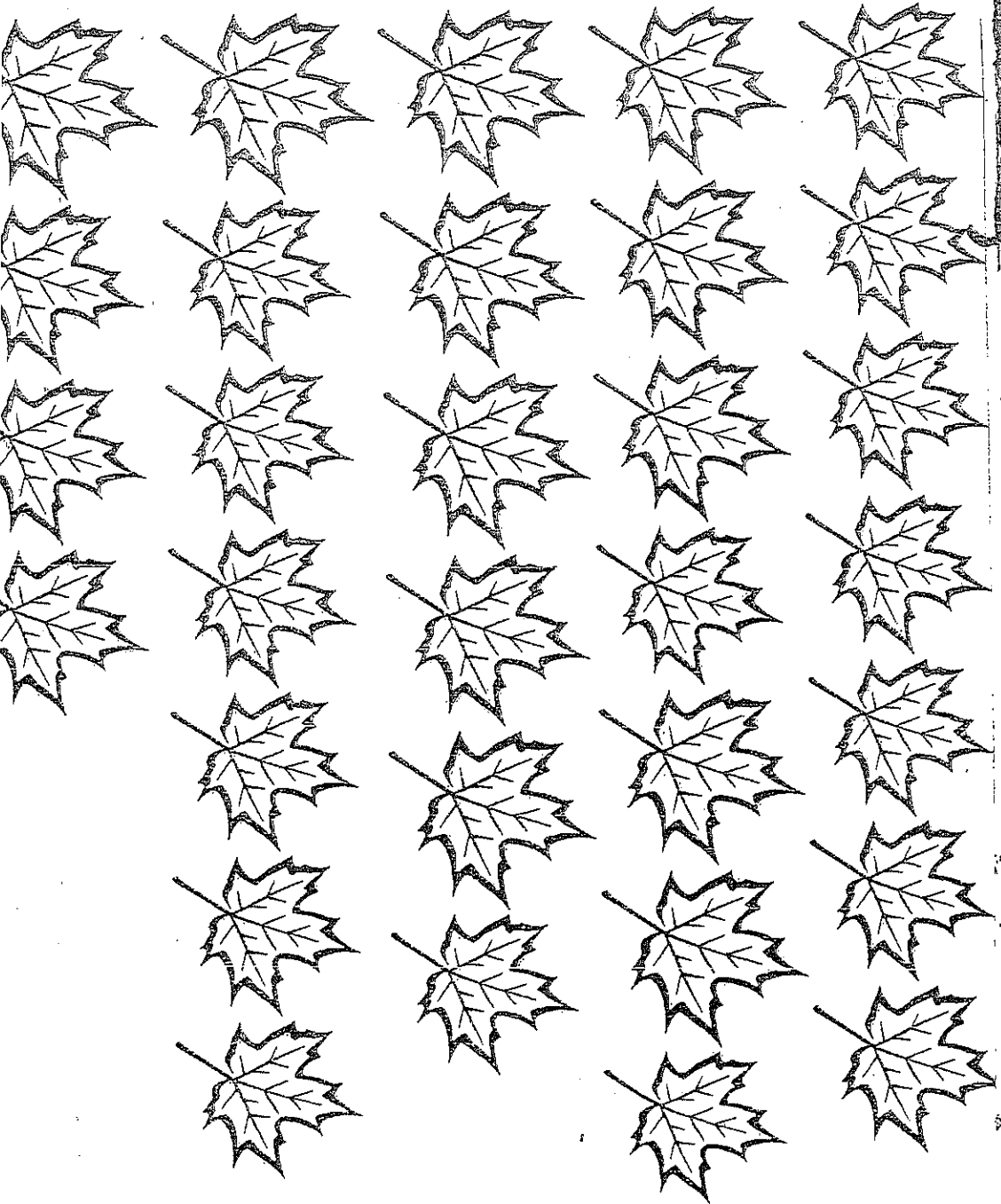




