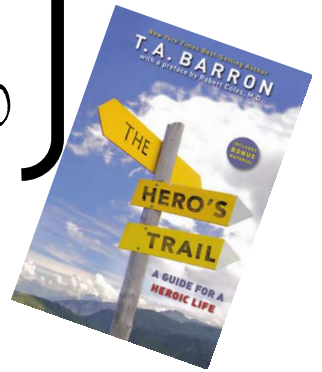


“For a hero, what counts is character.
For a celebrity, what counts is fame.” (Barron 3)



Is your hero a:

- **Hero on the Spot:** a person who helps to save someone in need by making a split second decision to intervene >>> relates to a person's character (Barron 16)
- **Survivor Hero:** a person who overcomes a major survival experience such as a plane disaster, accident, or act of terrorism >>> relates to a person's will to live (Barron 33)
- **Hero Within:** a person who overcomes a major battle within himself/herself >>> relates to a personal challenge such as a physical challenge, illness, addiction, depression (self rescue) (Barron 53)
- **Hero to Others Near and Far:** a person who connects to people by *setting the goal* to help others >>> relates to service to others nearby or miles away (Barron 75)
- **Hero for All Time:** a person who consistently shows courage, faith, perseverance, hope, humor, adaptability, moral direction, inspiration >>> relates to society's recognition of the person as a hero by many generations of people (Barron 99-101)
