

Annotated Bibliography

Part of the process of writing a research paper is compiling an annotated bibliography. In this bibliography you will need to compile **at least ten sources** for your research paper. Only websites that end .gov will be allowed for this paper.

What makes a bibliography annotated is a brief summary of the sources after the citation. In this summary you talk about the content of the piece, focusing on the impact it will have on your research, as well as the strengths and weaknesses of the source. Your summary needs to be about a paragraph in length.

Each of the entries in a bibliography should begin with the last name of the author, organization, or creator of the source. The sources are listed in alphabetical order.

Your annotated bibliography is due on the 5th of February.
