³Each time there is a large snowfall, a layer of snow develops which then sets on the top of the previous snow pack. ⁴If the new layer of snow does not bond strongly with the existing snow pack, the stability of the snow pack is affected, and could create the potential for a snow slide.

⁵Weather conditions can also influence the potential for a risk of an avalanche. ⁶If there are periods when the weather becomes warmer and some of the snow pack melts, the condition and makeup of the snow could change. ⁷These structural changes in the composition of the snow can weaken the bond between the layers of snow in the snow pack creating conditions favorable to an avalanche.

⁸Lastly, the steepness of the mountain slopes can be a factor in whether or not a specific area is more prone to an avalanche. ⁹The snow pack has to be strong enough to resist the natural tendency of gravity to pull it downward. ¹⁰Therefore, the steeper the slope, the stronger the bond of the snow pack has to be or the more likely the snow is to give way and slide downward.

¹¹Avalanches are not uncommon in colder mountainous areas of the country, yet many people still travel and seek recreation in these areas. ¹²The possibility of being caught in an avalanche, however, can be minimized if people familiarize themselves with some of the causes and triggers of avalanches.
