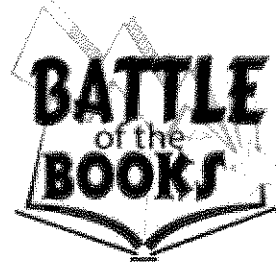


Battle of the Books

Round 1: Book Genre Challenge

- Read 8 (eight) of the genre book boxes in your ZPD range.
- Pass each AR quiz at 80% or higher.
- Record the book's title, author, and quiz score in the Challenge chart.

Completion date: Wednesday, February 24, 2016

Round 2: Team Battle

- Form teams of 3-4 students.
- Each team will read 3 titles (by lottery) of the Book Battle titles.
- Each team answers written questions and must score 90%+ to proceed to the next round of competition.

Completion date: Monday, March 7, to Friday, April 8, 2016

Competition: week of April 11

Round 3: Live Team Battle

Each team reads another 2 novels.

Completion date: Monday, April 18, to Friday, May 6, 2016

Teams compete in a live competition with rounds of questions.

Competition: week of May 9

All Round 1 participants will be included in a group photo for the Eastview newsletter

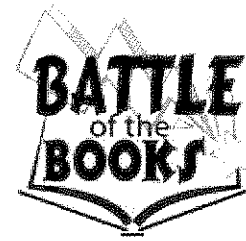
All Round 2 participants will receive a Certificate of Participation and special bookmark

Genres at a Glance

Fiction		
Code	Genre	Definition
TL	Traditional Literature	Stories that are passed down from one group to another in history. This includes folktales, legends, fables, fairy tales, tall tales, and myths from different cultures.
F	Fantasy	A story including elements that are impossible such as talking animals or magical powers. Make-believe is what this genre is all about.
SF	Science Fiction	A type of fantasy that uses science and technology (robots, time machines, etc.)
RF	Realistic Fiction	A story using made-up characters that could happen in real life.
HF	Historical Fiction	A fictional story that takes place in a particular time period in the past. Often the setting is real, but the characters are made up from the author's imagination.
M	Mystery	A suspenseful story about a puzzling event that is not solved until the end of the story.

Code	Genre	Definition
I	Informational	Texts that provide facts about a variety of topics (sports, animals, science, history, careers, travel, geography, space, weather, etc.)
B	Biography 920	The story of a real person's life written by another person.
AB	Autobiography 921	The story of a real person's life that is written by that person.

Other Genre		
Code	Genre	Definition
P	Poetry 811	Poetry is verse written to create a response of thought and feeling from the reader. It often uses rhythm and rhyme to help convey its meaning.
