

<u>BOTH</u>	1.-(ambos)	<u>verbo en plural</u>	<i>The black jumper is nice and the white one is nice too.</i> <i>Both jumpers are nice</i> <i>Both the jumpers are nice</i> <i>Both of the jumpers are nice</i> <i>Both of them are nice</i> <i>The jumpers are both nice</i> <i>Both these/those/my/your jumpers are nice</i>
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<u>EITHER</u>	1.-(cualquiera de los dos)	<u>verbo afirmativo en singular</u>	<i>Either jumper is nice</i> <i>Either of the jumpers are nice</i>
	2.-(ninguno de los dos)	<u>verbo negativo</u>	<i>I can't buy either jumper</i> <i>I can't buy either of the jumpers</i>
	3.-(tampoco)	<u>verbo negativo</u>	<i>I can't swim and my brother either</i>

<u>NEITHER</u>	1.-(ni..... ni)	<u>verbo afirmativo</u>	<i>Neither the black jumper nor the white one is/are nice</i>
	2.-(ninguno de los dos)	<u>verbo afirmativo</u>	<i>Neither jumper is nice</i>
	3.-(tampoco) = Nor	<u>verbo afirmativo</u>	<i>I can't swim neither / nor my brother</i>

<u>ALSO</u>	(también)	<u>posición central</u>	<i>She sings and she also plays the piano</i>
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<u>TOO / AS WELL</u>	(también)	<u>posición final</u>	<i>She sings and she plays the piano too/as well</i>
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- SHORT ANSWERS:
- *It's good. – I think so too.*
 - *I've got a headache. – I have as well.*
 - *I go to the beach. – So do I (formal)*
-- Me too (informal)

<u>SO</u>	(tan)	1.- <u>+ adjetivo / adverbio</u>	<i>This tea is so sweet / They get up so late</i>
		2.- <u>+ much / many + nombre</u>	<i>There're so many people / We had so much work to do</i>
		3.- <u>expresa resultado</u>	<i>He arrived so late that he missed his plane</i>

<u>SUCH</u>	(tan)	1.- * <u>+ a/an + adjetivo + nombre contable</u>	<i>It was such an amazing car!</i>
		* <u>+ adjetivo + nombre incontable</u>	<i>That was such excellent food</i>
		* <u>+ adjetivo + nombre plural</u>	<i>She had such big hands</i>
		2.- <u>+ a lot of + nombre plural / nombre incontable</u>	<i>There're such a lot of people / We had such a lot of work</i>
		3.- <u>expresa resultado</u>	<i>It was such a dark night that we didn't see him</i>

SUCH AS ((como) por ejemplo)

Some sports,, such as car raing,can be dangerous

LIKE (como) 1.- similar a / comparación

What a beautiful house! It's like a palace (but it isn't)

2.- lo mismo que

He's a teacher like me

3.- como por ejemplo

The floor has been polished. It's like been walking on ice. Be careful!

LIKE va seguido de gerundio, nombre o pronombre .

AS (como) 1.- + nombre: en calidad de.

I worked as a bus driver (I really was a bus driver)

He works as a slave (He was a slave)

He works like a slave (He works very hard)

2.- + oración: comparación

You should have done it as I showed you.

3.- + oración: expresa causa

As I don't speak English, I don't go to New York.

(mientras) + oración: (temporal)

As we were walking, we showed the accident.

SINCE (desde) 1.- + nombre (preposición)

I'm happy since last Monday

2.- adverbio de tiempo

A long time since ... (desde hace mucho tiempo ...)

3.- + oracion

-- conjunción de tiempo *Since I arrived (As ...)*

(ya que, puesto que) -- conjunción causal

Since you can come ..)

(como) en comparación

As I do. / As thick as a brick

As if / as though + subjuntivo:

Do it as if you were me.
