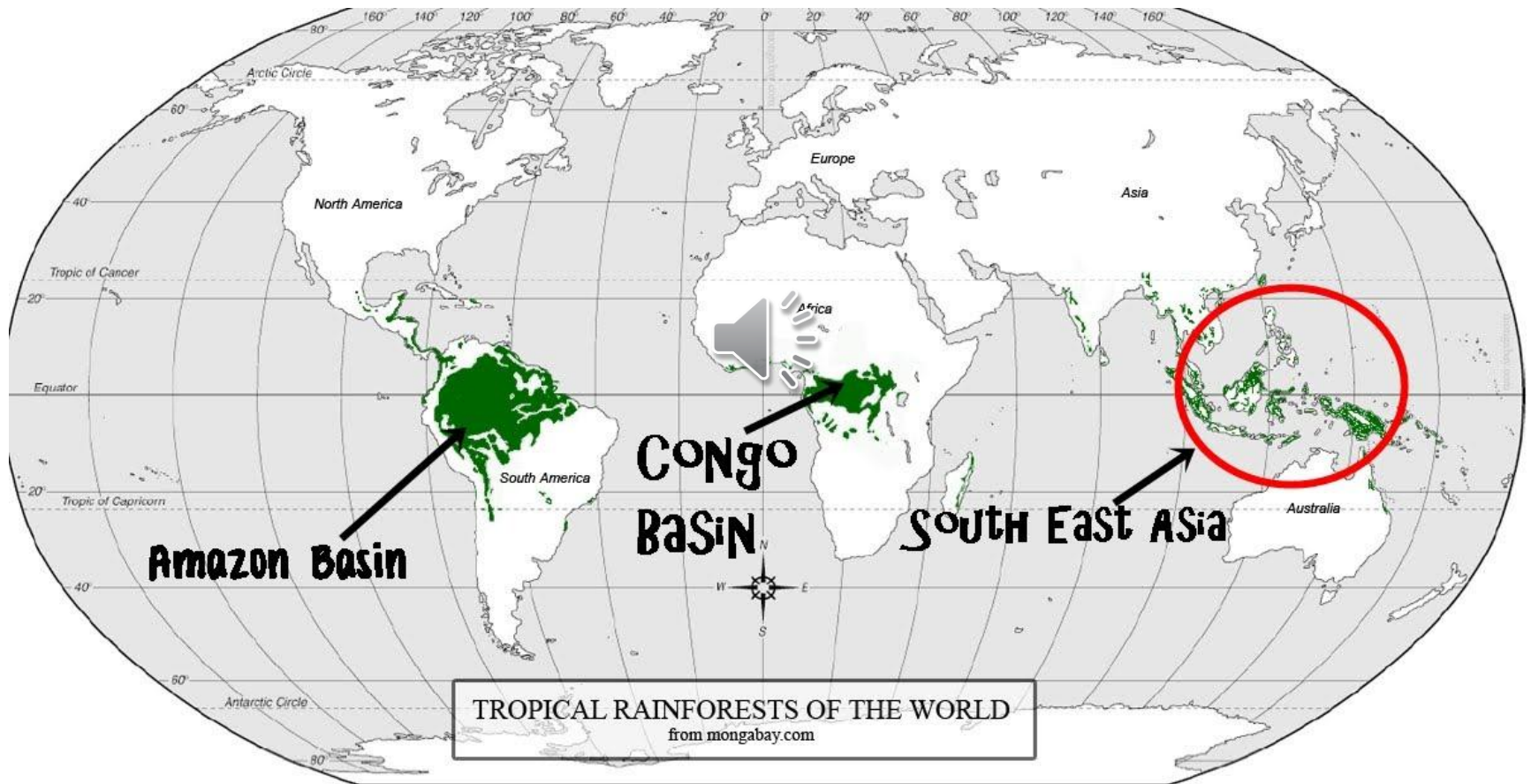


Southeast Asian Rainforests
