Content to study:

Goals objectives: The benefits of goals objectives.
A goals objective consists of a goals statement and an evaluation statement.
Components of a goals statement: learner, learner task
Components of an evaluation statement: conditions, observable student behavior, criteria

Be able to write a complete goals objective with all of its five components; be able to label the different components of a goals objective.

Example of a goals objective: The seventh grade math student will understand the rule of operations so that when give an equation requiring the rule of operations, the student will be able to apply the proper rule of operations with 100% accuracy.*

Learner: the seventh grade math student
Learner task: will understand the rule of operations
Condition: so that when give an equation requiring the rule of operations
Observable behavior: will be able to apply the proper rule of operation
Criterion: 100% accuracy

What the student does: The student simply memorizes and recalls information.
Simple Objective: The student will list the 50 states of the United States.

Lesson Plan: Be able to state the different parts of a lesson plan and define them.
