
WE LOVE CATS!!!

Vets diagnose and treat sick and injured animals. Some work in a general practice and treat all kinds of animals, but some specialize in cats or other animals such as dogs or horses.

Vets must be able to communicate with animals, and their owners, in a patient way, so the pets and owners know what the vet is doing and aren't scared about it. Vets must recognize symptoms of different diseases like cancer, and be able to tell what treatments and medicines to use. Good surgical skills are a very necessary thing.

A lot of training is required in order to become a licensed vet. You must have an interest in cats. You also need to be interested in science, biology, chemistry, physics etc. You should know a lot about science. You must graduate with a doctor of vet medicine degree, from an 'accredited'* school of vet medicine, and will need to be licensed in order to practice. Taking more classes even after you graduate is important, because you might not have studied everything that you need to know, and you will need to learn about new treatments that are discovered.
