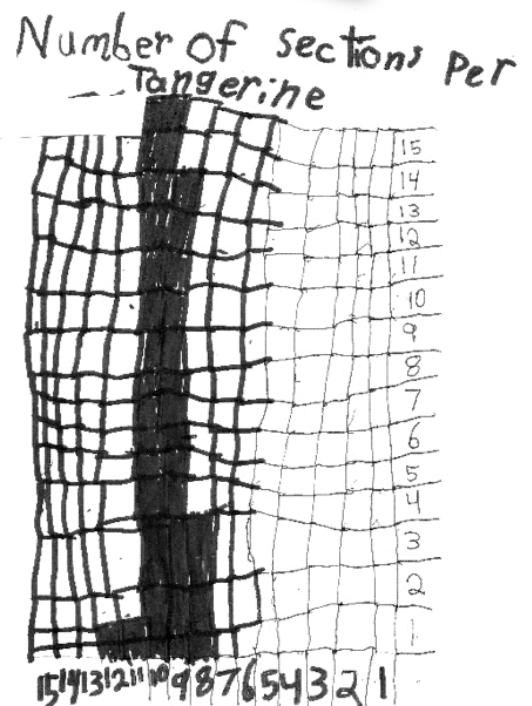
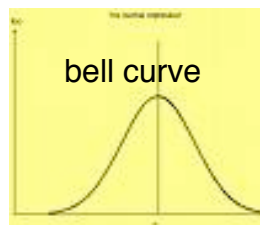

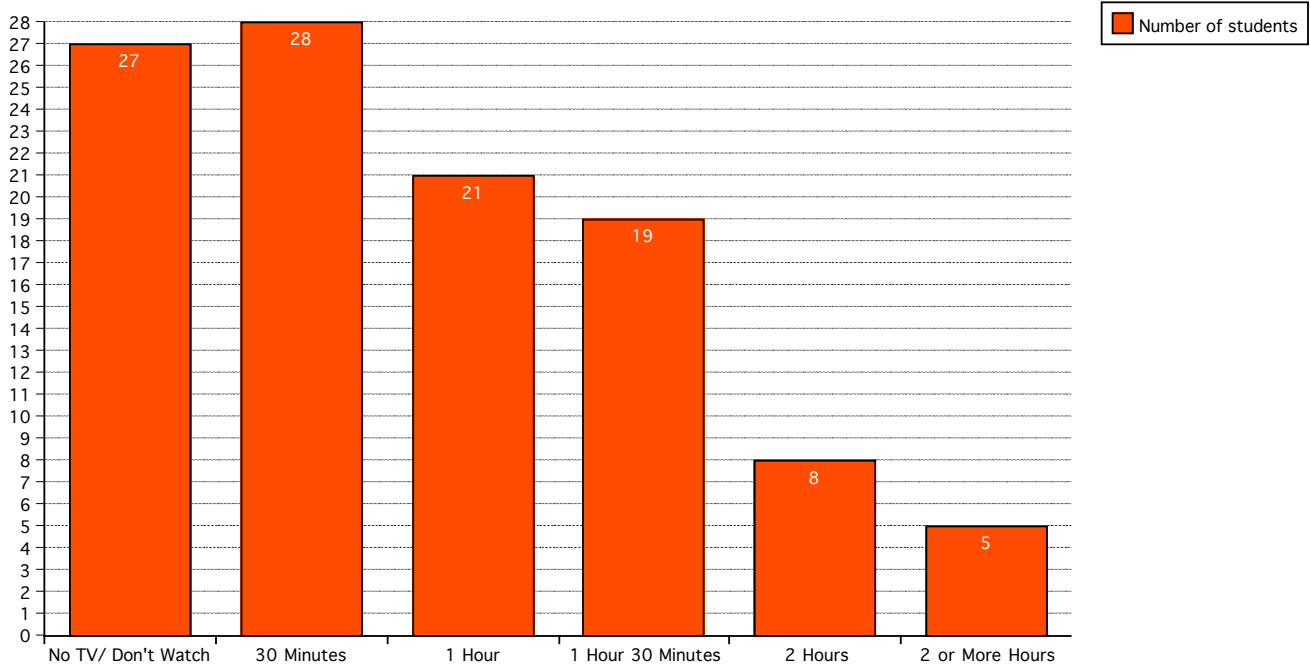
NORMAL DISTRIBUTION

How To Grow Crystals

Have you ever wanted to grow crystals? If you have, great! If you haven't, here is a recipe for growing crystals that we found at <http://chemistry.about.com/od/crystalrecipes/ht/bluetetecrystal.htm> It may take a while for them to grow but here's how:

first: Stir 22.5 grams of powdered calcium oxide into 200 ml of distilled water.

second: Add 48 ml of glacial acetic acid. Stir until the solution clears. Filter out any thing that does not dissolve.

next: In a separate container, dissolve 20 grams of copper acetate monohydrate in 150 ml of hot distilled water.

then: Mix the two solutions. Cover the mixture and allow it to cool undisturbed.

finally: The Crystals should begin to spontaneously deposit within a day. If no crystals form, allow a drop of the solution to evaporate onto a watch glass, scrape up the resulting crystals, and use them to start crystals growing in the main solution.

Be aware that these ingredients might be hard to find, so don't be disappointed if you don't find them at your local grocery store. Always be careful handling chemicals. Get your parent's permission before trying to grow these crystals.

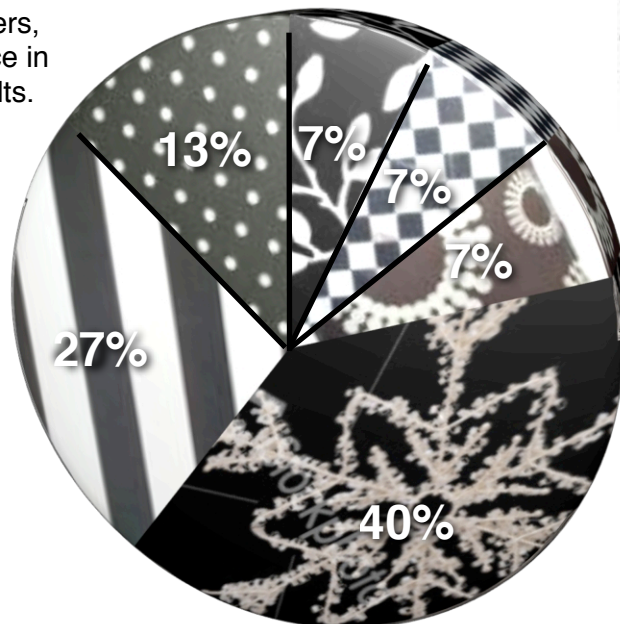
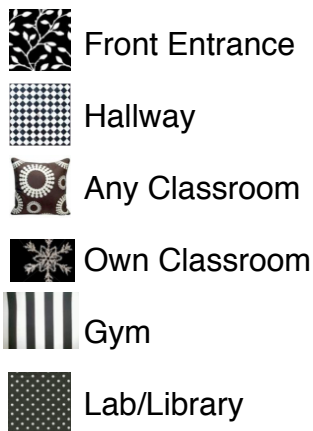

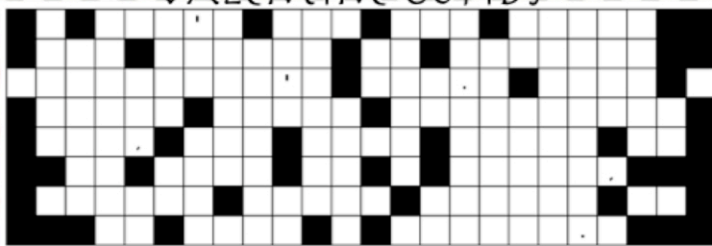
The Man in the Elevator

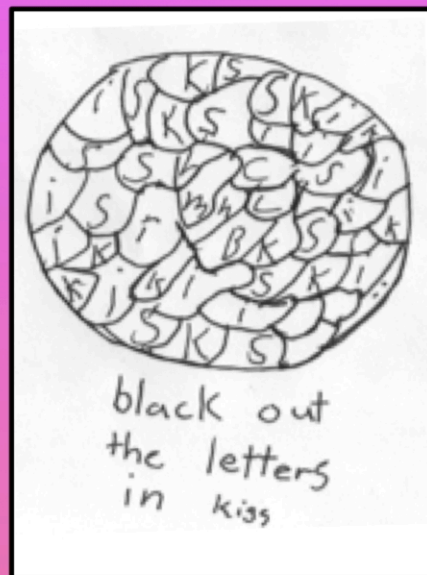

Why I like shortbread

by McKenzie, 3rd grade

I like shortbread because it tastes good and buttery. If you roll your dough 1/2 inch thick, the cookies will taste really delicious. If you roll the dough thinner, you will get more cookies.

My Aunt once made shortbread that tasted really bad. She used a different recipe that called for vegetable shortening. The shortening she used had gone bad. I suggest you check the butter or shortening before you cook.

Ingredients:

16 Tbs. butter, softened
1 tsp. vanilla extract
2/3 c. confectioner's sugar
2 c. flour
1/4 tsp. salt (if desired)

Preheat oven to 350 F and get out some cookie sheets. In a large mixing bowl, beat the butter until it is smooth and creamy, add the sugar and vanilla, and beat well. In a separate bowl, stir and toss together flour and salt (if desired), then add to the butter mixture, beat until completely mixed.

On a lightly floured surface, roll the dough until it is 1/3 to 1/2 inch thick. (Thicker is yummy, but makes fewer cookies.) Re-roll and cut the scraps until all the dough is used or cut the dough into mini shapes or pat it into a round pie pan, then cut into wedges like a pie for several servings. Place about one inch apart on ungreased cookie sheet. Prick each cookie 3 times with a fork or toothpick and bake for about 20 minutes or until they have barely colored around the edges. Don't over bake; they should not be brown. Remove from the baking sheet and cool on a rack

More History from Edison Alum Lucy Hart



We've had fun getting to know Lucy Hart, who went here over 50 years ago, so we sent more questions.

What was it like at Edison? - Ben

I loved going to Edison School. The classes were fun, our teachers dedicated, and it was a great way to make many friends and learn lots of things. I had some very favorite teachers including my fourth grade teacher, Miss Woodson, who had long blond curly hair and was lots of fun.

My fifth grade teacher, Mrs. Smith made up lots of learning games. One, I especially remember, was a contest to figure out the names of cities, given their popular names. For example Windy City (Chicago) the Big Apple (New York City). The hardest to figure out was "the Celluloid Capitol" of the world. See if you can figure it out. Mrs. Smith even went ice skating with us to Washburne Park when the pond froze over.

What grade did you start at Edison? - William

I started in kindergarden and went all the way through sixth.

How many students were there? - Edwin & Brooks

Oh, that's a hard question. There were two classes each grade with about 25 students each so with some simple math that would be $25 \times 2 \times 7 = 350$ students.

Tell us about the cafeteria. - Edwin, Michelle (parent)

Edison's lunchroom was right off the gym. I don't recall a hot lunch being served but most of us brought lunches from home. I think for a nickel we could buy a small container of milk. We kept our brown lunch bags in a cupboard in the covered play area. It was hard to pick out our own bag if our names were not on them. One day I told my mother that I really liked the lunch she had prepared for me and when I described it I found out I had eaten someone else's lunch! Around the 5th grade I was given a Hopalong Cassidy metal lunch box which I loved.

Later on I was taught how to prepare my own lunch so it never was a surprise what kind of sandwich I would have. I found it very interesting that many of my classmates would open their lunch sacks and be surprised to see the contents as their mothers had made them. Frequently there was trading of sandwiches. I always loved peanut butter and jelly or peanut butter and lettuce sandwiches which of course I had made myself. Typically I would have carrot sticks and an orange for dessert. We thought that children who had candy bars in their lunches were very spoiled. (I think that we were just envious).

What subjects did you study? - Ho Jeong

Oh my goodness that is a hard question. We had, of course, reading, mathematics, history, social studies, music, art, and my least favorite was a spelling bee as I was usually the first out.

What was the principal like? - Henry

Mr. Nelson was a very tall and skinny fellow. He always wore brown suits, brown shoes, brown ties and wore "granny glasses." He had along nose and a rather sweet smile although he could be stern. (None of us wanted to wind up in the principal's office). Although I am naturally a very bad speller

Mr. Nelson taught me the difference between the words "principle" and "principal". He said, "Remember that principal has a 'pal' on the end and I want to be your pal."

Who was your P.E. teacher? - Jasper

We did not have a P.E teacher. All we really had was recess. I think a father or two occasionally volunteered to teach the older boys how to play basket ball. We all played soft ball.

Was there a library? What was the play ground like? -Sahalie

We did have a library and it was located right across from where your main office is currently located.

We had the covered play area when it was raining and then we had the playground pretty much like you have now. Some of our favorite games were tag, hopscotch, rolly polli, kick the can, marbles, yo yo, (I still have the Duncan badge which I won in a yo yo contest). I can still make a yo yo sleep, walk the dog, around the world, rock the cradle but haven't been able to master loop the loop. My game favorite was rolly polli and it is played with a very hard rubber ball. If you want to know more about how to play rolly polli I could write your the directions and do a diagram of the game if you like. Did you know that children's games are traded by children to each other, generation after generation?



Did they have a (computer) lab when you went?

No, computers weren't even invented in those days. There were typewriters of course - manual - and if we wanted to do a school newspaper we used Mimeographs or Ditto machines. (You are going to have to look those up). You are so very lucky to have computers now and software to help you with your publishing. We would have loved to have them when we were in school.

Did you have to wear school uniforms? - Jasper

We didn't have school uniforms, but we did wear some things which may sound very strange to you. You may have to do some research. Girls wore pinafores, when raining we wore galoshes on our shoes, and when it was very cold girls wore woolen leggings under our dresses, but had to take them off when we got to school. In those days girls wore only dresses. I think it is much better now and more comfortable when girls wear long pants to school.

You didn't ask but we did not have TV when I was in Edison. We had the radio and we loved to listen to it. My favorite programs were, Cisco Kid, Sky King, Charlie Chan, Roy Roger, Batman and Robin, the Whistler, the Shadow, Tom Mix, Superman and Captain Midnight. I was able to get a secret decoder Captain Midnight badge by mailing in Ovaltine wrappers. Every week there was a secret code given at the end of the radio program and I used the badge to decipher the message. I understand that even now you can hear a radio program I loved this time of year called the "Cinnamon Bear."

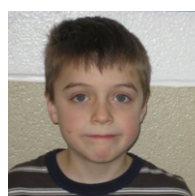
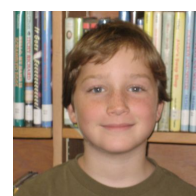
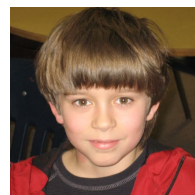
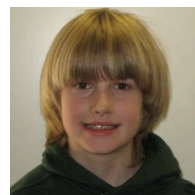
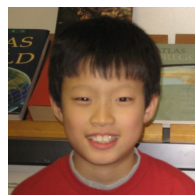
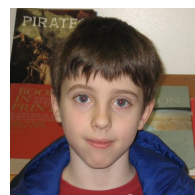
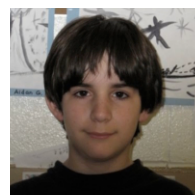
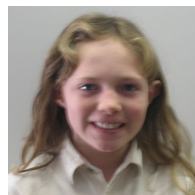
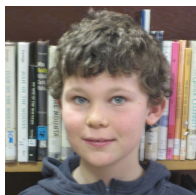
