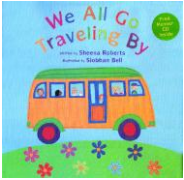

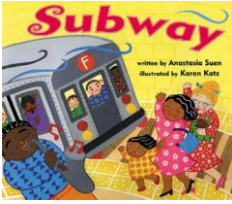
Ages 1-3

A nonfiction book full of facts that takes readers all the way back to 1885 describing the history of the automobile with colorfully illustrations and real photographs. The sections are broken up, but wrote in story form instead of in factual form. Table of contents and index are included. Appropriate for above level readers when teaching modes of transportation.

Ages 9-12



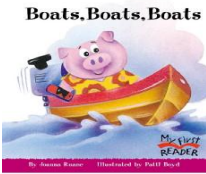
Suen, Anastasia (2004), *Subway*. Penguin Group

Ages 3+

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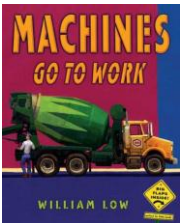
Boyd, Patti (2003), *Boats, Boats, Boats*. Children's Press: Scholastic Inc.

Ages 4-8

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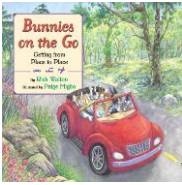


Low, William (2009) *Machines Go To Work*. New York: Henry Holt and Company, LLC

A colorful picture book that takes a look at other forms of transportation including helicopters, Cement mixers, fire trucks, back hoes, tug boats, tow trucks, locomotives, and container ships, and how these machines help us every day. Three pages foldouts show the machines at work, with added sound words to get students involved with the reading. Appropriate for all level readers when teaching modes of transportation. Includes a type of glossary describing each machine.

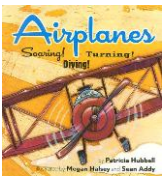
Walton, Rick (2003), *Bunnies on the Go: Getting from place to place*. HarperCollins Publishers

A family of bunnies use twelve different forms of transportation (car, train, wagon, tractor, balloon, boat, bike, truck, bus, ferry, cab, plane) to go on a vacation in this detailed, rhyming picture book. The use of rhyming gives context clues as to what form of transportation is going to be used next. Illustrations show detailed drawings of each mode to allow students to visualize. Appropriate for all level readers when teaching modes of transportation.

Grades K-2

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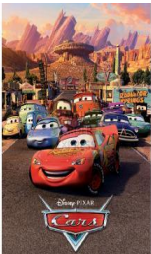
Hubbell, Patricia (2008), *Airplanes: Soaring! Turning! Diving!* New York: Marshall Cavendish Corporation

A creative combination of drawings and clipart show readers the different types of airplanes. With very descriptive language and illustrations, students are enriched with the information from the non-fiction book. Appropriate for all level readers when teaching modes of transportation. This book is one of a four in a series on transportation (Cars, Trucks, and Trains).

A comedy full of positive lessons where the main characters are vehicles.
