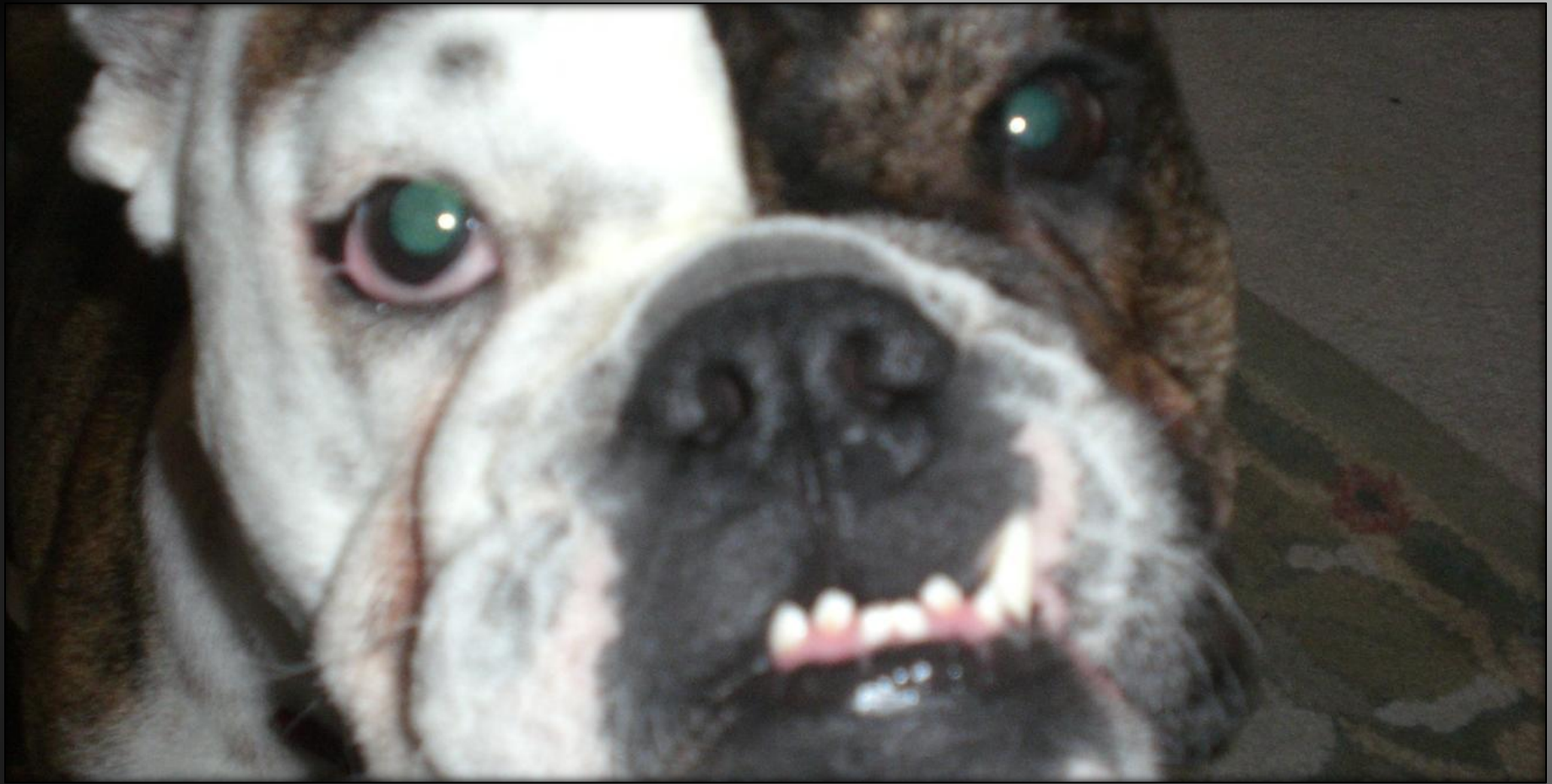

School Counselors are Accountable for Time Spent on Different Activities




Guidance Curriculum	35 – 45%
