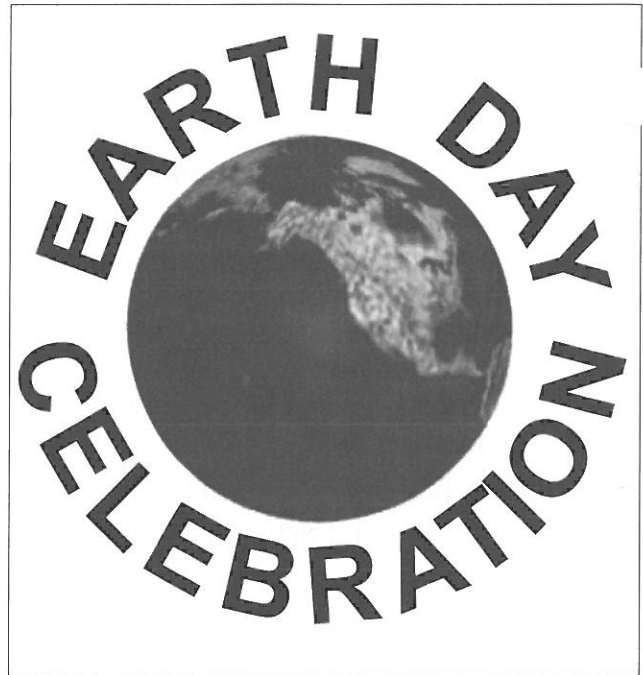


4. Earth Day Celebration

Earth Day was first celebrated on April 22, 1970 as a nationwide street demonstration. twenty million Americans turn out to hear politicians speak about issues concerning the planet. People participated in everything. From talkathons and prayer vigils to trail hikes. The message was loud and clear. Americans demanded action from their leaders because they were concerned about their environment. As a result, several environmental acts were passed in the 1970s. In 1970 alone Congress responded by establishing the Environmental Protection Agency and passing the Clean Air Act. The Air Pollution Control Act, the Toxic Water Control Act, and an Endangered Species Act followed two decades later.
