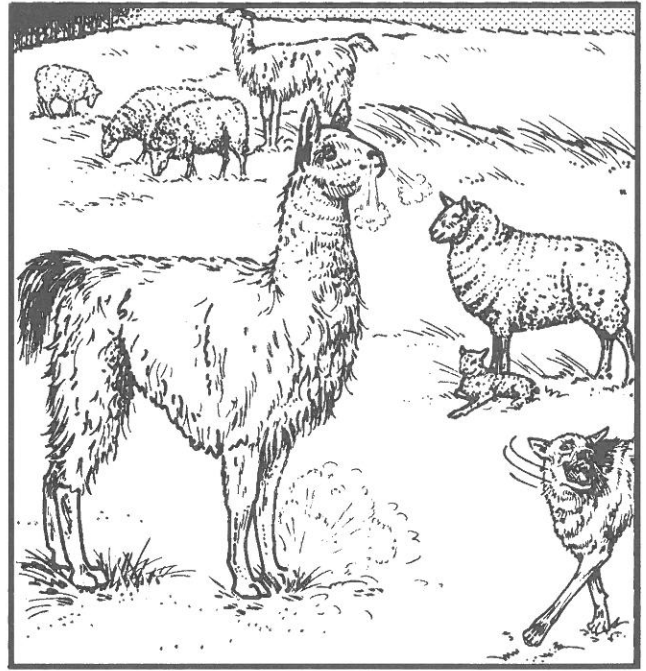


#### 4. Predators Beware

In south american countries, llamas are often used as pack animals. In the US, people are finding other uses for llamas. Some sheep ranchers use llamas to guard their flocks. Llamas graze in the fields with the sheeps and think of them as their herd. If the sheep are attacked, a llama will rush at the attacker and strike with their large hooves. It will also spit saliva into the attacker's face.

"Llamas are effective as the sheeps' protectors," says rancher Giselle Robinson, "Because they reduce the number of sheep lost to predators. Overall, Id say that we and llamas get along extremely well."



The llama is related to the camel. Llamas have no hooves but will use their large feet to attack the enemy. The llama above has just kicked a coyote that threatened the sheep herd.
