

Do you have an idea for Titan Pad in your classroom?

This could be used for Bell Ringer/ Morning Assignments. It looks like something that would speed up the process of the students writing the questions and answers. All the students can respond at once and gauge a quick easy assessment. Great idea.

This would be a great class starter to make the students aware of the target for the day's lesson. Without identification students can put an answer without intimidation. That's a good point. I agree I like that! I would use this for STEM. I would let students brainstorm as a group and then write their results and share.

I would also use this to form a debate on the amendments 4th grade need to know.

We could use this in our faculty meeting, You know, when no one wants to speak and all have an opinion. LOVE, LOVE, LOVE that idea!!! Thanks, maybe I would actually speak. SO often your opinion doesn't get spoken because your afraid of the consequences! :) Absolutely!

I plan to use this for morning work, centers, & especially throughout STEM. What a wonderful tool!!! Great idea for centers!

When having a group discussion, students can give their answers immediately, versus having to wait on being called upon. Often students get frustrated when someone answers before they do.

I am a Media Specialist, so I would demonstrate this to classes to use for reserch and group work collaboration. It could be used for groups to share notes or ideas for projects.

I would use this to help my students prepare information for a socratic seminar. They compile one place where they could put their evidence for all of the students to use. Then we can have the semiar after everyone has had the chance to see the evidence.

I could also use this as a place for an exit slip. If we are using the computers that day I can make an exit slip out of it and have them complete it before they get off and turn off the computer.

During group projects, students can work on the planning stage before beginning their project work. YES!

Titan Pad can be used for group projects in social studies for continental project discussions, as an English teacher, I can use it for editing, collaboration, pre-writing, and in the elementary school it can be used to discuss any literary readings.

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We suggested using the desktop computers as group hotspots. A representative from each student group could go back and type a response with a set time limit to return to the group. Another idea would be a collaborative writing project in which one student begins the story on line one and other students take turns to come up to the computer and continue the story. This could also be tied into a reading lesson with the Daily 5 (Reading Strategies). After a read-aloud, students can go back and write a prediction, connection, etc.

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Perhaps as a parking lot type of program where students leave the questions they still have?  
Would be good for daily editing...

I think this would be a great tool for even a morning procedure. I also think it could be a great tool for figuring out what students know on a topic. It could be organized in "K-W-L" and students could fill in facts they know or want to know. Then, groups could go back and write what they learned.
