#### **Part 3: Essay Response:**

This will likely be on Shakespeare's *Hamlet* or Vonnegut's *Slaughterhouse-Five*. It will be a broad question that covers several aspects of the book. You won't need to quote but you should be knowledgeable about the examples you are using. For example, it's helpful to know that Hamlet's play is called the Mouse Trap and Tralfamadorian is the name of the alien species that abducts Billy Pilgrim. Dresden is the name of the German city that is bombed. Ilium is where Billy is from. Give yourself AMPLE time for this section.
