# Visit to Gibraltar

Known as the 'Rock', Gibraltar is situated in a unique strategic location on the southern tip of the Iberian Peninsula, overlooking the Strait of Gibraltar and linked to the Spanish mainland by a narrow isthmus. Visitors are also assured of breathtaking scenery, wildlife and architecture, that captures the unique flavour of this Mediterranean city.

Gibraltar derives from Gibel Tariq (Tariq's Mountain) which is named after Tariq Ibn Zeyad who led the eighth-century conquest of Spain by a combined force of **Arabs and Berbers** crossing from Africa. Strategically important, Gibraltar was ceded to Great Britain by Spain in 1713 by the Treaty of Utrecht; it was formally declared a British colony in 1830. In referendums held in 1967 and 2002, Gibraltarians voted overwhelmingly to remain a British dependency.

**Government** British Crown Colony since 1713. **Head of State** HM Queen Elizabeth II, represented locally by Governor Sir Francis Richards since 2003. **Head of Government** Chief Minister Peter Caruana QC since 1996, re-elected in 2003.
