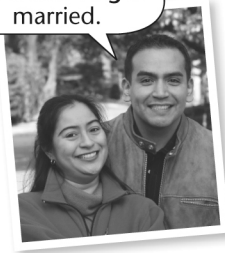

**GRAMMAR. Would like + infinitive: statements and yes / no questions**

Look at these examples with would like.

We'd like to get married.



She'd like to study art.

They **wouldn't like to have** children.

**Would you like to change** careers?

Yes, I would. / No, I wouldn't.

**Would they like to get** married?

Yes, they would. / No, they wouldn't.
