

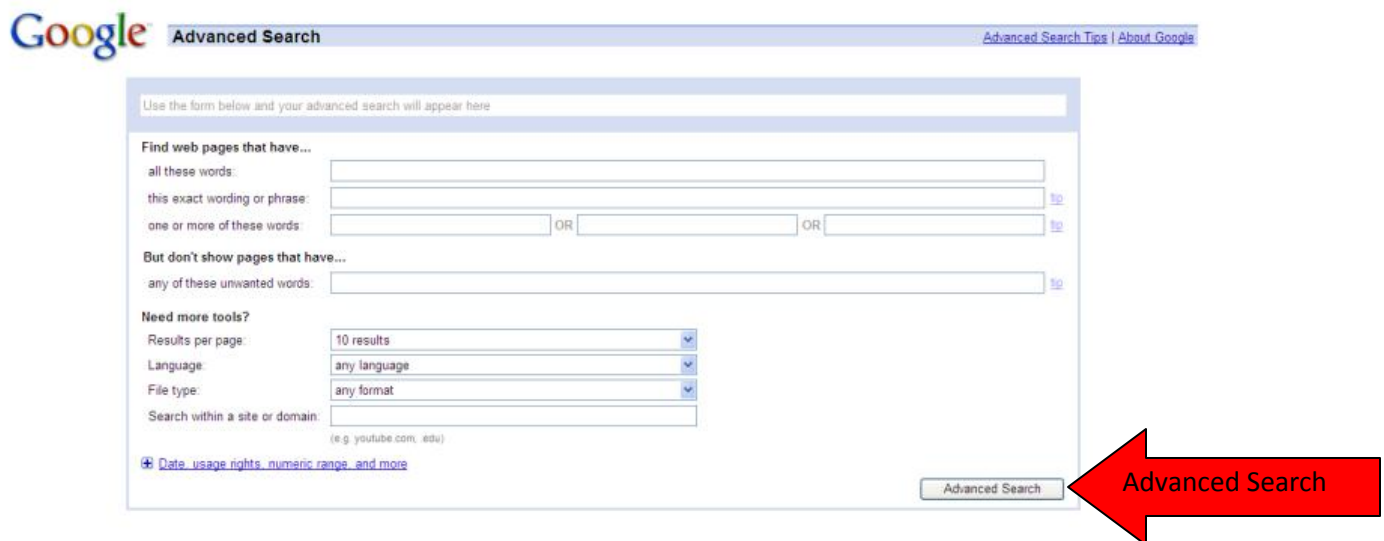

How to use Google Advanced Search for Web/Images

1. Type in www.google.com into your address bar.



2. Conducting a regular search you use the search bar. To conduct an advanced search you need to click on advanced search. Click on advanced search and you will see.



3. Fill out and click on advanced search.
4. You can use this advanced search feature for images as well. Just click on image on the top of the web page on www.google.com



5. You will now see an image search bar. Click on Advance Image Search



6. You will then fill out the form and then click on Google Search. You can also search for copyright free images which you are permitted to use on your documents, blogs, and websites.
