

GET ON

...means to have a good relationship.

CHECK OUT

...means to get more information about something.

BREAK INTO

...means to enter another person's house using some type of force.

PUT ON

...means to get dressed

STAND OUT

... (i.e. from a crowd) means to be easy to see or easy to notice.

LOOK FOR

...means to search for something.

TAKE OFF

...means to remove clothes

LOOK AFTER

...means to take care of somebody or something.

MAKE UP

...means to invent a story.

TRY ON

...means to wear clothes to see if they fit and if you want to buy them.

TAKE AFTER sb

...means to look or behave like an older member of your family.

TIDY UP

...means to put in order, to clean.

DRESS UP

...means to wear especial clothes (a suit, a tie) for a special occasion.

FILL IN

...means to write the necessary information in an official document.

HANG OUT

...means to socialize, to spend time with your friends.

SHUT DOWN

...means to switch off
e.g. the computer.

LET sb IN

...means to allow
somebody to enter.

HANG UP

...means to end a call; to
put a telephone
receiver back in its
cradle.

SCROLL UP/DOWN

...means to move the
computer mouse to see
the top part or bottom
part of the screen.

GIVE UP

...means to stop doing
something.

DEAL WITH

...means to take action,
i.e. to try to solve a
problem.

CALL OFF

...means to cancel an
event.

FIND OUT

...means to discover or
know something.

COPE WITH

...means to deal
successfully with a
situation or handle a
situation.

PUT sth OFF

...means to delay doing
something.

BREAK UP WITH sb

...means to end the
relationship.

STICK TO

...means to be constant,
to remain faithful to
something.
