EXPOSITORY:

I think that you finally got to the main point of your paragraph in the very last sentence. Try to move this idea up closer to the beginning. Secondly, you need to focus on just a couple (maybe 3 but not more than 3) that you should describe in more detail—the moments when you father did show you love in his own way. Right now, your paragraph does not have quite the amount of detail and detailed explanations that it needs. However, it has lots of good ideas and examples already—you just need to refocus them a little and add some detail.

DESCRIPTIVE:

Again, I think your main point is in the very last sentence—I like this idea that while your father is “average” and “obstinate,” he still has a way to show his love, that he “puts his whole heart” into his family. Try to move this idea closer to the beginning and focus your details and explanations more clearly on communicating this idea throughout the paragraph. The idea at the end is a good one and it could help to unite the other details and explanations (all your other content) if you build that idea into each example/point you make about your dad. Remember, too, to focus on giving concrete details—the ones that appeal to our senses. So, you might want to refocus the paragraph to be more narrative than expository, as it is right now.
