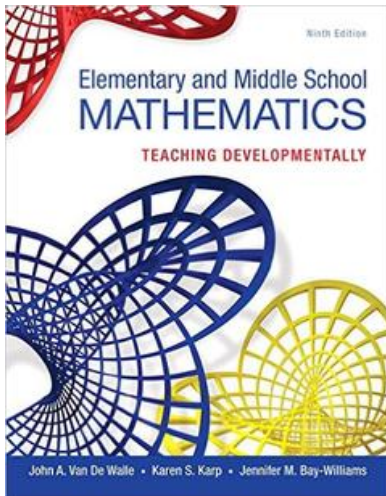


READING RESPONSES ASSIGNMENT SHEET

100 POINTS



You will need to maintain a learning log of reading responses for this course. You will complete templates based on course readings outside of class

Purpose:

Prepare you for class discussions and provide you with a written record of important content from your textbook. The chapters are quite dense with useful information and potential activities to complete with students. The templates are targeted to help you focus your out-of-class readings on developing important pedagogical content knowledge or PCK for math.

You will not be expected to read the entire chapter; however, you should read sections where you are directed to locate responses in order to be able to summarize in your own words. Some websites and videolinks referred to in the reading responses need to be accessed from the electronic version of the textbook. Please familiarize yourself with this resource.

How to Earn Full Credit?

- Type responses using the document provided for each reading on the wiki - "*Math Text Teaching Developmentally*" tab
- Complete **each** prompt provided in the template in your own words. In some cases if you need to use a quote, use quotation marks.
- Add the page number(s) where you located the information.
- If you use another source to find the answer please cite with the URL
- Keep track of the amount of time that you took to complete the template & include the time in minutes on your template.
- Post your completed template to the associated dropbox in iLearn by the evening prior to class.
- Print a copy of your responses and bring with you to class in order to be prepared for discussion.

You need to complete 10 out of the 12 reading responses using the guidelines above throughout the semester in order to earn full credit on this assignment – can earn up to 10 points per reading response). Points will be added to this assignment each week in iLearn so you can keep track of your performance over time. The 2 additional reading responses can potentially be used as extra credit.
