

# GOOD READERS QUESTION THE TEXT



Ask questions before, during, and after you read. Questioning helps you understand and find meaning in the text. It helps give you a purpose for reading.

**THIN** questions are easy to find the answers to. They are right there in the text and can be found with little searching.

**THICK** questions make you think and analyze the text. You have to search for the answers. You may have to think beyond the text.

You want to know something.

You wonder about things.

You want to better understand.

You are making predictions.

You want to learn more.
