HANDY TIPS FOR COLLECTORS

Friends, Are you bothered by unwanted odors? Do you have mold in embarrassing places? Then you need Curatorial Care of Works of Art on Paper. A mid-sized paperback by Anne F. Clapp, published by Lyons and Buford, 31 West 21 Street, NYC 10010, \$16.95. This is one of the better volumes on what almost anyone can do to save paper based "art" such as books, posters and other literature.. but NOT photographs. Ms Clapp has the answers to the questions we all have: How do you take the musty smell out of old books and papers? She has ways but first you have to realize you are dealing with mold. Once you understand that there are a number of ways to combat it, including building a relatively simple fumigator. **RATING:** This really is a good book on the conservation of paper.
