FREUD BELIEVED HUMAN BEHAVIOR COULD BE EXPLAINED BY AN "EXPANDED UNCONSCIOUS"

HE BELIEVED THAT EVERYONE HAD THREE PARTS OF THEIR PERSONALITY; AN **ID** (PRIMAL URGES), AN **EGO** (REPRESSION OF THOSE TRAITS TO EXIST IN SOCIETY), AND A **SUPEREGO** (INTERNALIZATION OF SOCIETAL VALUES TO FORM MORALITY)

FREUD HAD A LIST OF DEFENSIVE MECHANISMS INCLUDING, REPRESSION, RATIONALIZATION, PROJECTION, REACTION FORMATION, SUBLIMATION, DISPLACEMENT, DENIAL, COMPENSATION

WHILE SOME OF HIS WORK HAS BEEN SUPPORTED BY MODERN RESEARCH, MUCH IS NOT SUPPORTED.
