

1920s and 1930s Quilt

As you are about to learn things for America changed rapidly during the 1920s and 1930s. You will be constructing a piece of a quilt with 3 other members that will come together to form 1 quilt that represents the changes from a view point during the 1920s and 1930s.

Each member will be given a topic for their portion of the quilt. The quilt will need to be divided diagonally from corner to corner. It is important that you divide your half of the quilt appropriately. All the 1920s should meet in the middle and the 1930s will be on the outside.

For the topics you must select a view point from someone or a group of people from the time period. For example: if you have society and culture and you choose your view point to be on women and African Americans then that is what you need to find information and pictures on from the 1920s and 1930s.

On the back of each portion of the quilt there needs to be an explanation showing the changes in life during the two decades according to your view point. On the final day you will meet with your group to attach your Quilt.
