- A. <sup>1</sup>Societies go through several stages in the production of goods. <sup>2</sup>In many less developed countries, most people produce their own products and then consume them. <sup>3</sup>As a society continues to grow, however, a person's or household's special talents are recognized. <sup>4</sup>For example, one person may be very good at carpentry, one at baking bread, and one at growing vegetables. <sup>5</sup>Soon an exchange process takes place: "I'll trade you my bread or several loaves of it for the table and chair you've just built. <sup>6</sup>Chances are, I can bake the bread better and faster than you can, and I know you can build the tables and chairs better than I." <sup>7</sup>Eventually, several households begin to produce surplus products beyond their immediate needs. <sup>8</sup>People produce more and more until they no longer have time to engage in exchange activity. <sup>9</sup>They then turn their products over to one person or to a store that agrees to handle all further exchange activities. <sup>10</sup>In this manner, a modern marketing system is created.

- B. <sup>1</sup>From observing chimps in the wild, Jane Goodall made two important discoveries that brought her international fame. <sup>2</sup>One discovery was that chimps make and use tools. <sup>3</sup>As Goodall looked on, for instance, several chimps plucked long blades of grass, stripped off the leaves, licked one end to make it sticky, and poked the stem into a termite nest, pulling it out covered with termites. <sup>4</sup>These they licked off as a child would a lollipop.

<sup>5</sup>In addition, Goodall discovered that chimpanzees eat meat—on a regular basis. <sup>6</sup>Goodall frequently saw them catch, kill, and devour bushbucks and bushpigs. <sup>7</sup>She also saw them frequently kill and eat monkeys and young baboons. <sup>8</sup>Indeed, Goodall saw her chimps throw rocks and use sticks as clubbing weapons.
