Orange	Yes	We only transfer devices that have been highly customized for a student, and can not be recycled/used with another student, for example the device is no longer being made but the student is successful in using it to meet their communication needs. We have only transferred device upon graduation from OCPS and the device is transfer to the parent not another agency. We average 1 or 2 a year.	No	I don't understand what is being asked, so I am assuming we don't. When we transfer the device there is no exchange of funds.	Yes

Volusia	No	We have not had to do this. We've had 2-3 students who have "kept" their AT devices but they were very low tech, not considered equipment items, and we just "gave them" and then removed them from our current database.	No	We call the manufacturer to get their depreciation schedule for equipment items - we've had to do this when gifted an item, or transferred an item from an ATEN original purchase. The district has policies about how to handle gifted items, but I don't have a copy. I don't think that is what you need, anyway.
