(Usually the home page or a category if web page is extensive. Sometimes may be the same as the page title.)

(Usually found at the bottom of the home page. May be in the web site title. Use N.p. if information is not available.)

(Usually on the bottom of the home page. Sometimes lists only years. Use n.d. if information is not available.)

(The day you found this information on the Internet. Check printout for date.)

**Notes on World Wide Web citations:**

- Use this form for any sources located using a search engine & with a url that reads: <http://>
- According to MLA 7<sup>th</sup> edition, web url's are no longer required in source citation information, although MLA leaves the use of url's to the discretion of the teacher. At Ancillae we will continue to cite web sources by including the url. You should retain your sources in case your teacher has a question about a source.

**For Ancillae's subscription Databases or for PowerLibrary databases:**

- Use the source citation information provided by the database publisher. The source citation information is usually available at the end of the article. If the source citation information does not print, please select the "Cite this" or "How to Cite" buttons that are found at the top of the database article. You may copy and paste the information to your Word doc.
- For database articles that use the medium publication indicator of "Web", substitute "Database." This is a change from the MLA citation that will be used at Ancillae.
