

NoodleTools Tip Sheet – Advanced

Database: WORLD BOOK ADVANCED

Use this tip sheet if:

You have PRIMARY sources from WORLD BOOK ADVANCED

World Book Advanced may be used as a source for National History Day only if the source used is primary. Make sure your source was selected from the Primary Source category.

Each citation may have different bits of information, depending upon the original source, but all bits of information will follow the same format of author, title, etc.

Here are three examples of different citations from *World Book Advanced*. The Tip Sheet follows the examples.

Anatomy of WORLD BOOK ADVANCED source citations

Format for example #1:

Author(s). **"Article/entry title."** **Date of reprint.** **Title of original publication (book).** **City of Publication:** **Publisher,** **Date of publication** (book). **Database name.** **Format** **Date of access.** **URL.**

Benjamin Franklin. **"Benjamin Franklin's Account of the Stamp Act"** **1888.** **American History Told by Contemporaries.** **New York:** **The Macmillan Company,** **1902.** **World Book Advanced.**

Example #2 - next page

Format for example #2:

Author(s). "Article/entry title." Date of reprint/publication. Title of original publication (book). City of Publication: Publisher, Date of publication (book). Database name. Format Date of access. URL.

Bigelow, John, and Benjamin Franklin. "Benjamin Franklin Experiments with Electricity" A.D. 1747. The Great Events by Famous Historians, Vol. 13. Harrowgate, TN: The National Alumni, 1926. World Book Advanced. Web Date of access. <http://www.worldbookonline.com>

Format for example #3:

Author(s). "Article/entry title." Title of original publication. (database name) Publisher, Date of publication (database). Format Date of access. URL.

Ned Blackhawk. "Trail of Tears" World Book Advanced. World Book, 2011 Web Date of access. <http://www.worldbookonline.com>

- For Online Retrieval : Basic Information
 - Name of Web site or online database - You will select either *World Book Advanced* or *World Book*, depending on your source citation

Complete the Annotation at the bottom of the form and check for errors.



Check for errors and Generate citation. Double check against source citation.

Note: For National History Day Annotated Works Consulted (aka Annotated Bibliography) return to your NoodleTools Works Cited page to select primary and secondary source attributes.

To select attributes:

1. Click on the box to the left of your source.
2. At the bottom of the page, select the drop down Attributes box
3. Select “primary” or “secondary” to describe the source
4. Click on “apply”

Before converting to a Word doc, you will need to select “primary /secondary” at the sort box on the upper right.
