

Printing WritingFix's Post-It Templates on actual Post-It notes

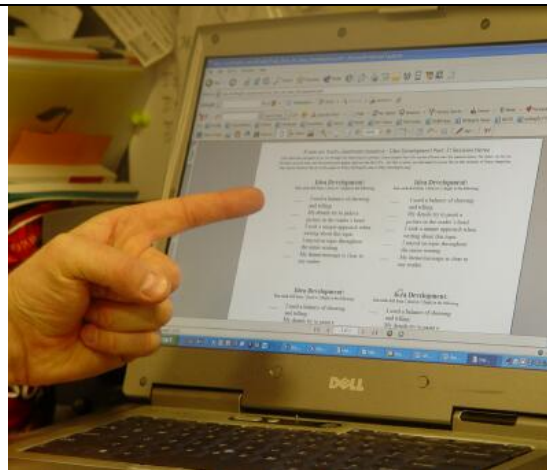
5 steps to printed Post-Its

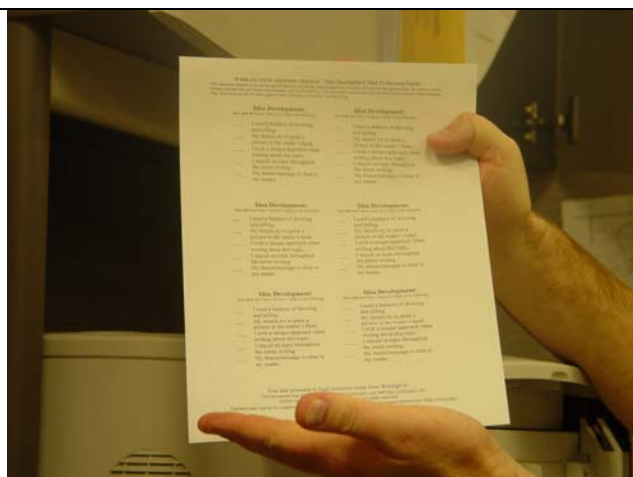
I often get asked, "Don't you jam your printer doing that?"

I only jammed the printer once. And it was easy enough to fix. I turned off the printer and carefully pulled out the piece of paper.

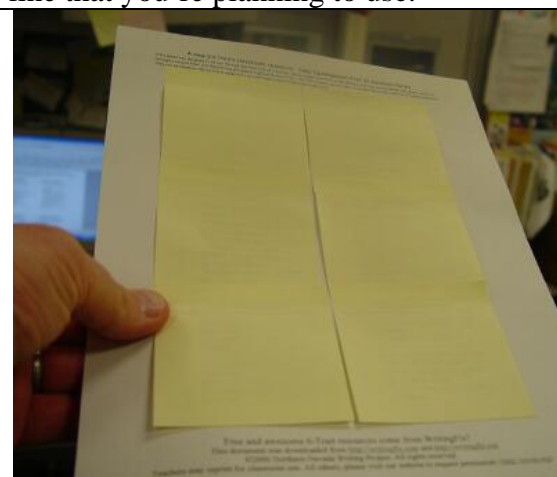
My best suggestion to not cause printer jams is to overlap the Post-Its, as you will see in step three below.



Step 1: Bring up the Post-It Template online that you're planning to use.



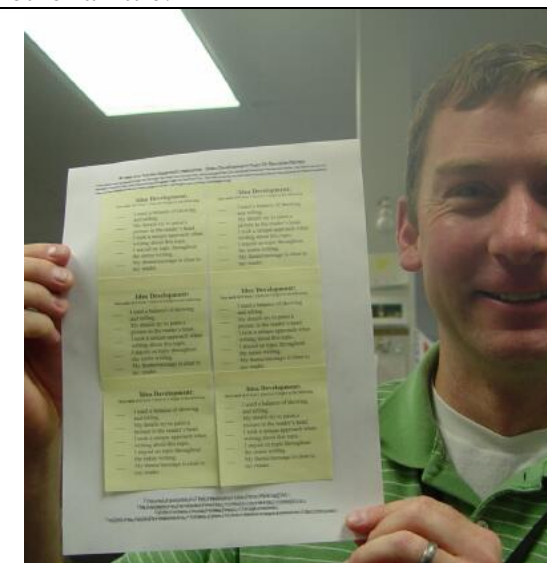
Step 2: Print enough copies to satisfy the number of Post-It's you'll be making.



Step 3: Use six 3 x 3" Post-It notes to cover the six Post-Its that were printed on the paper. The Post-Its will overlap each other a little.



Step 4: Place the sheet in your printer's feeder tray. Some feeder trays ask for face up (like mine), but some require face down. Consult your printer's instructions, if unsure.



Voila! Printing again will put the printed words right on the Post-It Notes.
