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About the FortiToken 300

The FortiToken 300 is a USB Smart Card Token for X.509 PKI certificates used in securing Internet transactions for applications including signing/encrypting email, PDF documents, Microsoft Office files, and software, as well as for strong authentication for your VPN or web-based applications. Client certificates provide higher security than OTP tokens for two factor authentication, although the private key of the PKI certificate must be kept secret to be effective. Private keys generated and stored on the FortiToken 300 are more secure than private keys stored as files on local hard disks because the FortiToken 300 cannot be coerced to expose the private key.

Software installation

The following platforms are supported:

- Windows 2000 Professional/Server (32-bit only)
- Windows Server 2003 (all versions)
- Windows Server 2008 (all versions)
- Windows XP (all versions)
- Windows Vista (all versions)
- Windows 7 (all versions)

To install the client software:

1. Login to the Fortinet Customer Service & Support website at: <https://support.fortinet.com/>
2. Select *Download > Firmware Images*, then select *FortiToken* from the dropdown menu.

3. Save the *FTK300_Setup_V1* file to an accessible folder
4. Run the installer by double-clicking *FTK300_Setup_V1.exe*.

Using the Token Manager

To use the Token Manager:

1. Plug the FortiToken 300 into a USB port on your computer.
The first time you do this, you will be reminded to change the default PIN if it has not already been changed by your system administrator.
2. Select *Yes* and the Manager interface will be displayed.
3. Select *Change User Pin* from the interface to create a new PIN.
The default PIN is set at the factory to *1234*; use this for the *old user PIN*.
4. You will now be logged into the Manager.
The buttons available on the interface are: *Login*, *Import*, *Export*, *Delete*, *Change User PIN*, *Change USB Key Name*, *View Certificate Information*, and *Exit*.

You can find the shortcut for the Manager by selecting *Start > All Programs > Fortinet > FortiToken*. Click the shortcut to start the *FortiToken Token Manager*. With the token plugged in, you can also double click on the FortiToken icon in the system tray to start the Manager.

The Admin version incorporates some additional functions and can also be found at the Fortinet Customer Service & Support website at: <https://support.fortinet.com/>. The main interface includes a triangle button for switching the other buttons displayed on the interface. The Admin version can be used to initialize a token, unlock a token, and change the admin (SO) PIN. The default SO PIN is **\$Fort1N3t!**.
