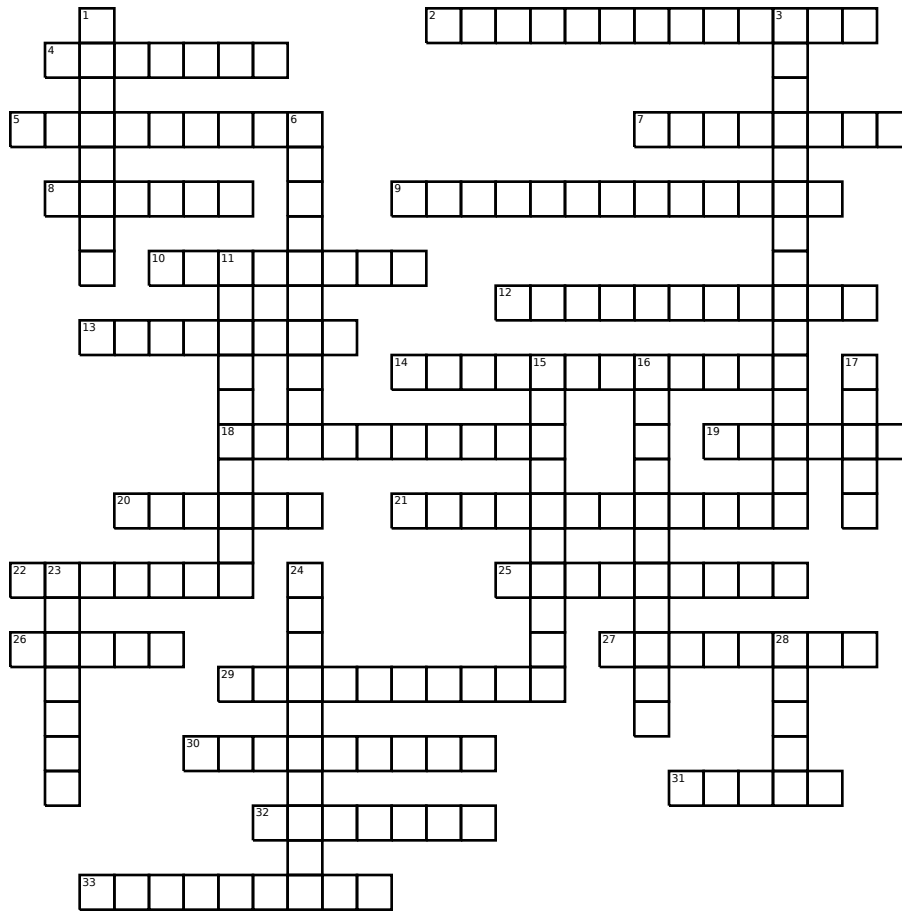

- 13 An explanatory or documenting note or comment at the bottom of a page, referring to a specific part of the text on the page.
- 14 The use of words that imitate sounds
- 18 The logical decision or opinion you reach by pulling together several facts or details
- 19 The high point in the action of the plot.
- 20 A figure of speech that uses like or as to make a direct comparison between two unlike ideas.
- 21 The repetition of initial consonant sounds
- 22 Prose writing that tells about imaginary characters and events.
- 25 The derivation of a word
- 26 A brief story or poem, usually with animal characters, that teaches a lesson
- 27 A quotation showing a particular word or phrase in context
- 29 The part of the plot that introduces the setting, the characters, and the basic situation.
