Slide 2		Front cover: Carlos Goes to School
Slide 3		1. This is Carlos. Today is his first day of preschool. Carlos' family speaks only Spanish, and he is scared that he won't make any new friends.
Slide 4		<p>2. Ms. Smiley, Carlos' teacher, meets Carlos at the front door with a big smile on her face. She says, "Hola, Carlos. I am Ms. Smiley!" Slide 5		<p>3. Ms. Smiley says, "Carlos, you are just in time to join us for our morning circle time. You can sit with Maria. She speaks Spanish, too." Carlos smiles. Ms. Smiley shows Carlos his spot and says, "Sit down." Ms. Smiley shows Carlos a picture of children sitting in a circle. Maria says "Sentarse." That means sit down in Spanish.</p>
Slide 6		<p>4. Ms. Smiley says, "'It's time for centers.'" She tells Carlos that Maria will be his amiga for the day. Amiga means friend in Spanish. Carlos heads to the block center, takes the large truck from Stephen, and goes to the other side of the room to play by himself. Stephen sits down and starts to cry.</p>
Slide 7		<p>5. Maria goes straight to Carlos. She tells him that sharing is when you play together and take turns. Maria and Carlos walk back over to Stephen. Maria tells Carlos how to say "I'm sorry." Carlos gives Stephen the truck back and says "I'm sorry." Stephen says, "Thank you, Carlos." Maria tells them it is almost time for almuerzo. Almuerzo means lunch in Spanish.</p>
Slide 8		<p>6. Ms. Smiley takes the class to lunch. Carlos gets his favorite food, a hot dog. He doesn't know how to ask for ketchup, so he points to the bottle. Maria says, "'That's salsa de tomate.'" Maria tells Carlos he should say halagar when he asks for something. Halagar means please in Spanish.</p>

Slide 9		<p>7. Ms. Smiley tells Carlos to line up to go to the bathroom. Carlos gets in front of all of his new friends. Stephen pushes him out of the way. Maria reminds Carlos how to say "I'm sorry."</p>
Slide 10		<p>8. After the bathroom break, Ms. Smiley takes the children out for recess. Carlos runs and runs. He climbs all the way up the ladder, but he starts to cry because he is scared to go down the slide. Stephen sees that Carlos is scared and goes to help him. Stephen tells Carlos to be brave, and Carlos closes his eyes and slides down all by himself.</p>
Slide 11		<p>9. Carlos says, "Gracias, amigo." Maria tells Stephen, "That means thank you, friend in English." Stephen asks Maria how to say you're welcome in Spanish. Maria tells Stephen, and he looks at Carlos and says, "Denada, amigo."</p>
Slide 12		<p>10. Ms. Smiley blows her whistle, and the three friends go back to the classroom together for story time.
