## Setting up your Google Doc!

1. Everyone log in to your Google Account  
<http://google.com/accounts>
2. Go to DOCUMENTS link (Google Docs)
3. One member click **New**
4. Type a title for your Document in the Document (Ex: "Group 1 Web 2.0 Notes")
5. Click **Save**
6. Now, click **Share with others**

Type in Group Member's Google Account email address and click **INVITE**. Can SKIP sending the message.
