

THE BIBLIOGRAPHY

The Bibliography is an alphabetized list of the sources used in the research and writing of your paper. It is the last component of a research paper and follows all of the text and appendices, if any. When you are ready to write your bibliography, simply alphabetize your bibliography cards by the first letter of the entry, and transcribe the information onto a sheet of paper. Form is important!

Format:

* **Source written by a single author:**

Russell, Frazier. Ernest Hemingway, Romantic Adventurer. New York: The Kipling Press, 1988. Print.

* **Source written by two authors:**

Adams, Katie, and Lee Quiring. Ernest Hemingway. New York: The Kipling Press, 1988. Print.

* **Source compiled by an editor:**

Smith, Jane, ed. Hemingway. New York: Harcourt Brace, 1995. Print.

* **Source written or edited by more than two authors:**

Zacuto, Catherine et al., ed. The Norton Anthology of American Literature. New York: W.W. Norton & Co., 1985. Print.

* **Signed magazine article:**

Smith, Jane. "A Writer's Life." The Windmill 30 July 2008: 12. Print.

* **Unsigned magazine article:**

"Obama." Time Magazine, vol. 30 Mar. 2009: 6-8. Print.

* **Encyclopedia with an author:**

Brown, Patrick. "The Roman Empire." The World Book Encyclopedia. 2004 ed. 2004. Print.

* **Encyclopedia with no author:**

"Archaeology." The World Book Encyclopedia. 2004 ed. 2004. Print.

* **Signed newspaper article:**

Macias, Rey. "The Democratic Convention." Los Angeles Times, 4 September 2008. 4-6. Print.

* **Unsigned newspaper article:**

"The Presidency." Los Angeles Times, 12 September 2008. 1. Print

* **Unpublished material:**

Anderson, Howard. Personal Interview. 11 January 2008.

* **Internet with an Author:**

Frost, Les. "Guidelines for Dissecting Frogs." *Froguts*. 9 January 2006. Web. 12 April 2009.

* **Internet with no Author:**

"Mesopotamia." *Mesopotamia* The British Museum, 22 October 2008. Web. 20 March 2009.

THE BIBLIOGRAPHY

Tips:

1. Entries are alphabetized by the first letter of the entry (**not** including articles: a, an, the)
2. The author's last name is placed first, followed by first name and middle initial. If there are two authors, the second author's name appears as usual - first name, then last name.
3. There are no numbers before the entries.
4. A period follows each entry.
5. All books or publications are italicized, or underlined, if writing by hand on note cards.
6. In the case of multiple-lined entries, note the indentation.
7. There is a space between entries.
