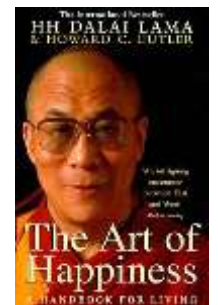


Art of Happiness, The

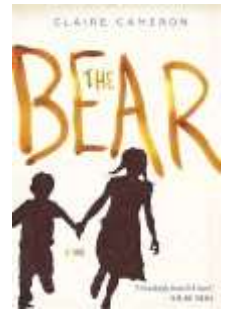

A powerful suspense story narrated by a young girl who must fend for herself and her little brother after a brutal bear attack.

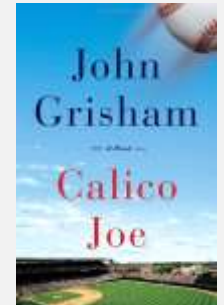

The careers of a golden boy rookie hitter for the Cubs and a hard-hitting Mets pitcher take very different paths.

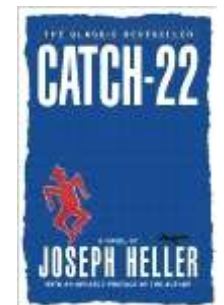

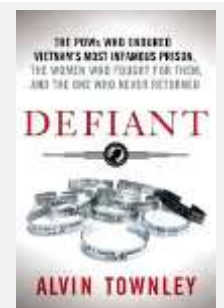


Defiant

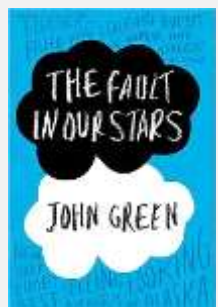

Sixteen year old Hazel, who has cancer, meets Augustus at a kids-with-cancer support group and, as they fall in love, they both wonder how they will be remembered.

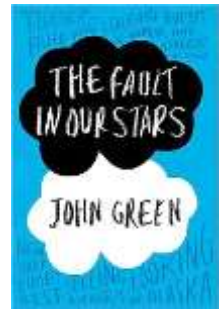

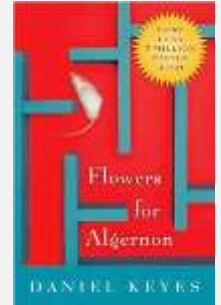
Flowers for Algernon

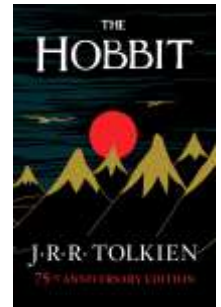

This stirring adventure is a fantasy that introduces the far-wandering hobbit, Bilbo Baggins.



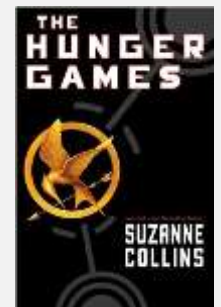
Hunger Games

Hayley Kincaid and her father move back to his hometown to try a "normal" life, but the horrors he saw in the war threaten to destroy their lives.

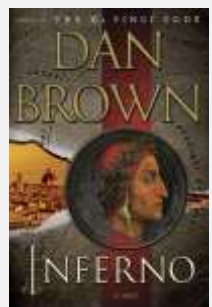

This is a humorous account of a New York City teenager's battle with depression and his time spent in a psychiatric hospital.

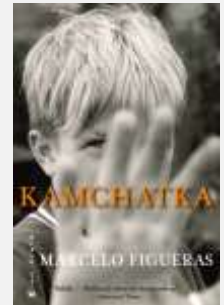

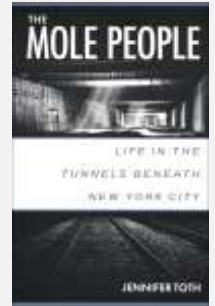


Mole People

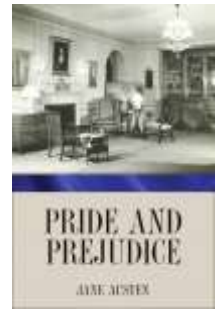


Pride and Prejudice

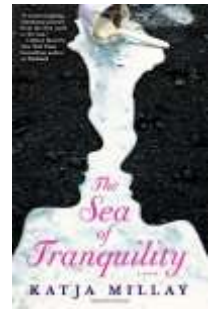


Sea of Tranquility, The

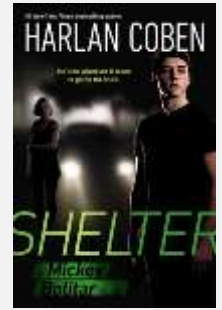
Shelter (Book One): A Mickey Bolitar Novel

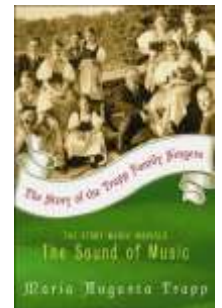


Story of the Trapp Family Singers, The

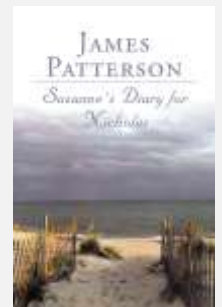


Suzanne's Diary for Nicholas [GRADES 11-12 ONLY]

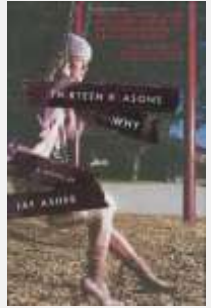


Thirteen Reasons Why

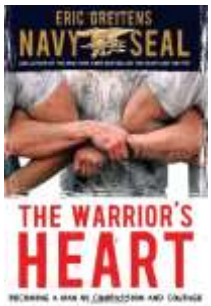


Warrior's Heart, The

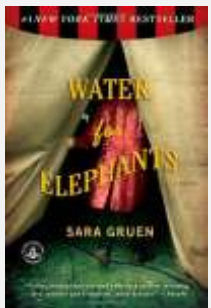


Water for Elephants

Ninety-year-old Jacob Jankowski finds himself haunted by memories of his past in the circus and the freaks, exotic animals, and other people he encountered as a performer.

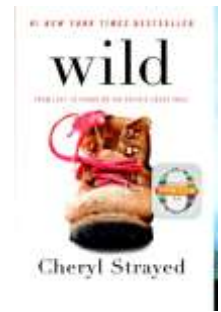
