Why Articulation?

Articulated credit awards full college credit for high school courses where there are common competencies taught between the secondary and postsecondary institutions.

Articulated credit is designed to eliminate duplication and to facilitate a seamless transition between high school and college curriculum in career and technical education programs.

Note: a Master's degree for the instructor is not required since these are **AAS degree courses**. Students must earn a "B" or better to receive NECC credit.

Process to Articulate

Local high school teachers should contact **Amanda Nipp, NECC Director of Early Entry Programs** to begin the process (amandan@northeast.edu).

*A course syllabus or course outline and the table of contents from the course textbook must be submitted for articulation consideration.

NECC faculty will review course and accept or make recommendations for course equivalency. The high school course must be a **direct equivalent** for the articulation to take place.
